
WHY SUPERYACHTS?

DAY 1 -3

Day 1 - Introduction to the Superyacht Industry

Your new career starts here. We'll kick off with a real-world intro to superyacht life — the roles, the departments, the expectations, and what chief stews are actually looking for in new crew. You'll meet your crew (aka classmates), get your workbook, and learn how to manage your superyacht salary — because you're about to start earning serious money. It's the full superyacht 101 that sets the tone for everything ahead.

Day 2 - Barista Training & Formal Dining Theory

Start your day learning how to craft the perfect flat white — complete with latte art and milk texturing like a pro. Then we dive into five-star formal dining theory: table settings, service order, guest etiquette, and what makes luxury service truly seamless. This is where your eye for detail begins to shine.

Day 3 - Formal Dining Practical, Fine Wine Appreciation & Service

Today's all about bringing the luxury to life. You'll kick things off with formal dining service practicals, including silver service and synchronised service — techniques used on the most elite yachts in the world. Then it's onto wine, cheese, and caviar appreciation, led by a professional sommelier. You'll explore major wine regions, taste what you'll actually serve on board, and practise how to pour, present, and serve wine with confidence. The goal? To make you feel comfortable around fine wines — and confident serving them to guests.

DAY 4 - 5

Day 4 - Housekeeping, Mixology & Guest Judges

Back to basics — but make it luxury. Today we cover high-end housekeeping, including hospital corners, cabin presentation, turndown touches, and wardrobe management. Then it's on to mixology, where you'll learn to shake, stir, and serve cocktails with style. You'll be assessed live by industry guests, so expect high standards — just like on board.

Day 5 - Onboard florals, Final Exam & Graduation

You'll spend the morning creating guest-ready floral arrangements, learning what works on board and how to keep blooms fresh at sea.

Then it's time to review the week, ask final questions, and sit your written exam. You'll need a minimum of 70% to pass — and yes, we coach you all week in a way that's designed to stick.

Weekend Break

After an intensive week mastering the interior — you'll enjoy a well-earned weekend break. Stay local and explore vibrant Auckland city and its beautiful surroundings, or head home for a reset. It's the perfect chance to switch out your skort for boardies and a rashie as we gear up for deck training the following week.

DAY 6 - 8

Day 6 & 7 - Powerboat in the Hauraki Gulf

This is what you signed up for. You'll be out on Buccaneer 635 HT powerboats with 175hp Yamaha four-strokes — big-beamed, grunty, and built to move. You'll train like you're on charter: launching, docking, navigating, and handling boats under pressure. The Hauraki Gulf delivers the perfect mix of thrill, learning, and views that make your mates jealous.

To help you hit the water with confidence, we'll send you the RIB Master/Powerboat online theory component before the course begins. That way, you'll be up to speed and ready to make the most of the practical training on Day 6 and 7.

Day 8 - ½ Day Session of VHF Radio Practical

This session ensures you understand how to operate onboard and handheld radios, EPIRBs, SARTs, AIS, and DSC-enabled devices — and, most importantly, how to communicate clearly and confidently in emergencies.

You'll get access to online study content ahead of time, which needs to be completed before the hands-on session. Then we'll bring it all to life using real VHF training units, finishing up with a combined theory and practical assessment.

WHAT YOU'LL WALK AWAY WITH

You'll finish the course with three internationally recognised IYT qualifications:

- IYT Professional Superyacht Hospitality
- IYT Powerboat & RIB Master
- IYT VHF Marine Communications

With hands-on training across both departments, you'll finish this course ready to step into any junior role and be a genuine asset to any professional superyacht crew — inside or out.
