Passive Voice

Use and Form - Basic Rules

Remember:

- We use the Passive voice when what happens is more important than who does it.
- The object of the active sentence becomes the subject of the passive voice.
- We form the Passive voice with the auxiliary verb **Be** (always in the same tense as the verb in the active voice) and the Past Participle of the main verb, followed by a **by**-phrase, the agent, when we know who or what performed the action.

Children's day is celebrated on June 1st.

Yeah, Lots of trees **are planted** yesterday.

Street traders **sell** black-market products.

Black-market products **are sold** by street traders.
