<u>Poecilia Velifera</u> (Giant Sailfin Molly)

The Velifera are found in central America, in the Yucatan Peninsula of Mexico.


These mollies are also known as the "Mexican sail-fin molly, and the Yucatan molly.

You can probably catch your own when you vacation in Florida, since many have been introduced by hobbyist into the local streams and canals.

Poecilia Velifera are a mainly grey-green. They have also been bred in other colours such as orange, and an albino form. These mollies are large, growing up to seven inches. The Velifera can be a little sensitive to a sudden temperature change by two degrees or more. It is also suggested by some hobbyist is to add a little salt to the tank, but I do not feel that it is necessary.

This molly should be kept in hard alkaline water. A PH between 7.5 and 8.5, with a temperature between 24–27 degrees Celsius. They are very easy to feed, eating flake and live or frozen foods. Some greens should also be added to the tank as well.

When it comes to breeding, they should be in a planted tank to protect the fry. You could also remove the gravid female and place her in a breeding trap. Mine are in a bare bottom tank, where the fry are staying at the bottom, undisturbed by the parents. I have removed several though, to another grow out tank.




