

OAA AWARDS PRESENTED AT THE SEPTEMBER MEETING

Poecilia Salvatoris (Liberty Molly) a BAP report by Dave Furness

The Liberty molly is a short-finned molly from El Salvador. The males and females have similar colours along the flank of the body. They both have a silvery body with some blue and orange speckles if in full colour. Mine are simply silver. The male's dorsal and caudal fins are edged with orange. There is also black and white on the dorsal as well. The red, white and blue on the fish was the reason the fish was called the Liberty molly. The maximum length of the male is 3 inches, while the females grow a bit larger.

If you want to spawn these fish, you should put them into a species tank. This tank should be heavily planted, and well stocked with floating plants as well. The temperature of the tank is around 76 degrees F.

I had learned from a club member that these fish need to eat several times a day, for they tend to get skinny and die if not fed well. I have fed them a variety of foods, such as flake, live and frozen food. They have spawned for me twice, before I contacted Tom B. to witness my new arrivals, and they continue to spawn. The first two spawns had 12 fry each. I lost the first spawn.





Neocaridina cf. zhangjiafiensis (Snowball shrimp var. white) by Dave Furness

This shrimp is about 1 inch in length, and are called snowball shrimp because of their white eggs that look like snowballs.

I have my shrimp in a 5 gallon tank with a lot of floating plants for cover, along with a sponge filter. The temperature of the tank is about 74 degrees F. The recommended parameters of the water is having a pH range from 6.0 to 8.0, and the water temperatures from 72 to 84 degrees F.

This shrimp is extremely prolific. It is 30 to 45 days from pregnancy to hatching. When some of the shrimp eggs turn black, they are ready to hatch soon. The black spots are the eyes of the shrimp. Feeding the shrimp is easy. They will eat blanched spinach, zucchini, algae wafers, shrimp pellets, flake food, bloodworms etc. .




