



# Prohibited Species in Ontario

It has been brought to my attention that in past auctions there have been a prohibited species of crawfish, as well as a prohibited species of plant up for auction.

The Common Yabby - Cherax destructor is a prohibited species in Ontario.

- > This species carries a possible fine of up to \$250,000 for each specimen.
  - > Egeria has been seen at one of the last auctions, this plant species

carries the same possible fine.



# The A.H.A.P. Program A Brief Explanation By: Andrew Fruck

As the new A.H.A.P co-ordinator I wanted to briefly explain the A.H.A.P program. The A.H.A.P program was designed to recognize plant enthusiasts who have successfully reproduced plants in their ponds, and aquariums. Some of these plants are easy to reproduce, while others may take more work and experience.

Please remember some plants reproduce through seeds, some through cuttings such as stem plants, while others grow baby plants on them such as sword plants, and others such as some water lilies reproduce via a rhizome.

In order to qualify for an A.H.A.P certificate you must have the reproduction verified by the A.H.A.P coordinator and the form filled out. Once this has been done, a certificate will be issued.

If you have any questions please do not hesitate to ask.


