






Remember this?



MEET YOUR MEMBERS

I've been keeping fish off and on for at least 40 years . It was my father that got me interested in the hobby. I remember him coming home setting up the tank , and throwing a bunch of fish in and wondering why they all died. So I took it over. Over the years I've had many varieties of tropical, cichlids, and goldfish. Even had a bit of luck breeding angel fish. Right now I have 8 betta tanks, a 75 gallon for my baby red Oscar, and a low maintenance planted tank with shrimp and endlers. But my favourite by far is my pond it is filled with shubunkins, comets and butterfly gold fish last year we added Asian butterfly koi, best place to be in the summer. I heard about the club through online searches and meeting Paul and Ry. I won't tell you which one but first impression wow this guy really likes to talk about fish. I enjoy going to the meetings for the socializing but also learning about fish I'm not that familiar with as well as plants and new ideas.

Aulonocara baenchi

Aulonocara baenchi is also known in the hobby as Nkhomo Benga Peacock, the Yellow Regal Peacock or Baensch's Peacock among others. It is a small cichlid, with an average length of 4 to 5 inches, Some males can grow to 6 inches. In Lake Malawi, they can be found near the Maleri Islands, Chipoka, Nkhomo reef near Benga, and Usisya. There can be some slight colour variants among the different locations. They inhabit shallow water, but often inhabit deeper depths as well.

The one that I have has a bright yellow body with a hint of blue. The face below the eye is blue.

They have a mellow temperament, and even seem less aggressive during spawning compared to the other Aulonocara species. In the wild, females may school together, while the males defend their individual territories.

The Aulonocara are sand sifters, and enjoy meaty foods such as sand dwelling invertebrates. Tank specimens enjoy a variety of foods, such as flake, pellets, any type of frozen or freeze dried foods, along with live brine shrimp. To keep them happy, they should have regular water changes per week, up to 50 percent. The preferred tank setup should have some open space along with some caves and rocks for hiding places and spawning. The tank should be at least 40 gallons or more. Here are some of the aquarium conditions that should be kept. The temperature should be between 73 to 84 degrees. The PH, should be between 7.8 to 8.6. They prefer low lighting and can be a little skittish when the light is too bright.

It is best to have 2 or more females per male when trying to breed this fish. The Aulonocara are mouth brooders, and the female can carry from 20 to 40 fry, for about 21 days. When the fry are free swimming, you can feed them finely crushed flakes as well as newly hatched brine shrimp.





