

#### Aulonocara Sp.

#### **Dragon Blood Peacock cichlid**

This attractive cichlid, which can grow up to six inches, is not native to the African Rift Lake system, but an aquarium hybrid. The colours of this fish can be orange,pink,red,or yellow. There are some albinos as well. the males are brightly coloured,while the females are plain to white.

I find them to be semi aggressive toward other cichlids, and only seem to get aggressive toward other Dragon blood males or males from

other Aulonocara species, when interested in mating.

Aulonocara species are carnivores and should be fed live foods, frozen blood worms, shrimp etc. .

When i decided, I was ready to spawn them, I set up the tank as a Malawi tank, with hard water. The temperature of the tank should be between 78 and 82 degrees, and the PH between 7.8 and 8.0. A lot of rock work make the fish feel a lot more comfortable, and provides protection for the mouth brooding females.

The fry, like all Aulonocara fry are easy to feed. All that I use for them is brine shrimp, micro worms, or fine flake food.





