


Finally,

SCAAS Auction: It is happening November 9th 2014.

The team from London Area fish club will be in charge of registration, CHITs and running the computer program. They have a software which automatically will calculate a person's total once all the items have been sold. Ken will bring our printer just in case something happens with the one from London. Tom will talk to the London Area fish club team to see if they would like a small gift other than gas money and paper for the printer. Ron and Tom will be doing the auctioneering. The auction forms are up on the internet for people to find and print off before the auction.

Ken will bring new batteries and the microphone for the sound system. Ken will pick up tickets for the raffle, 50/50 and food tickets. Food tickets can be given out to the volunteers. Ken will pick up 6 tables to rent for auction day. Emma and Joe will return them on Monday.

Joe has advertised with Kijiji, Facebook and Cogeco.

BAP REPORT

Betta Channoides

Betta channoides is a species which is endemic to the island of Borneo, where it is only found in the province of Kalimantan Timur. This fish inhabits shallow acidic brown forest streams, where the PH is from 4.0 to 6.5. Mine bred at a PH of 7.6.

I have placed my pair in a ten gallon tank, with very little gravel and some floating plants. Small coconut half shells are placed on the bottom, where the male likes to incubate the eggs. The water temperature is around 76 to 78 degrees F., and the PH was 7.6.

These fish are fussy feeders, and only accept live foods, such as daphnia, brine shrimp, bloodworms and white worms. They are not fond of flake or pellets. The male has a red body with some black and white on the tail. The female is rather plain. They are very slow moving fish that can be kept in a small species tank, with both male and females together.

When breeding, the female pursues the male, the male then wraps his body around the female where milt and eggs are released. The eggs are picked up by the female and then spit into the water column for the male to catch and hold, there can be from 1 to 40 fry at a time. The incubation period is between 10 to 21 days. The parents will not normally harm the fry. The fry are fed, when released by the male, microworms or newly hatched brine shrimp. I think that the female should be removed after spawning, for she may attempt to spawn with him again, before the incubation time is over. If pursued while holding, he may spit them out prematurely and spawn again.

BAP REPORT

Xenotoca Eiseni

Redtail Goodeid

The redtail goodeid is from the highlands of Mexico, and can be found in clear streams to polluted ditches. The areas that they are found in are heavily vegetated. The water temperature there vary extremely. The temperature ranges from 59 to 86 degrees F., and the PH ranges from 6.0 to 8.0.

There happens to be only three species in the Genus Xenotoca. They are Xenotoca eiseni, melanosoma, and variata. The female eiseni can grow to 2.8 inches and the male grows to 2.4 inches. The head of this species is pointed, and the mouth is small and undershot. The dorsal fin is set far back and is larger in the males than in the females. All fins are rounded. The colouration varies according to the population. In the male at the rear of the body, before the tail, the colour is blue, then orange at the caudal peduncle. If you want these fish in a community tank, I must warn you though, that these fish are known to be nippers.

I have been told by a few people that had them, that they are very easy to spawn. Well the first three times that I had owned them, I had no luck with them at all. The first three times I left a pair in a well planted tank, where they were well fed. I never saw a single fry. This time I placed the pair in with only a few floating plants, and fed them some flakes, live foods, and a lot more vegetation in their diet. The female was looking heavier, but her gravid spot was not showing too much. I decided to do something different this time with them, so I took the female out and placed her on her own. A week later, there were quite a few fry. The gestation period time is between 55 to 62 days. There can be 10 to 50 young born, each measuring 1.5 m .The fry are large enough for all foods. These fish should be fed a lot of vegetation






