

St. Catharine's Aquarium Society September 2, 2014 Executive Meeting Minutes

SCAAS Auction: It is happening November 9th 2014. Tom as well as the team from London Area fish club will be in charge of registration. Joe will advertise with Kijiji and Cogeco. Pam or Roman will have the sign up forms and registration forms. Pat will be able to update these forms once we have a hold of them. A request volunteer in September's meeting.

Refreshments: Nobody has volunteered for this position. Joe to bring in coffee, milk, sugar and a dozen donuts. We still have pop and water left over from last year but for the October meeting more will be needed. We can ask for a different volunteer at each meeting until somebody accepts the position. We also need volunteers for the refreshments at our auction. We can ask Shawn and Shirley if they would be still willing to do the June BBQ and possibly the auction.

Changes to the Jar Show: Possible ideas to update the jar show: get rid of fish of the month and just have an open class, have 1 month specifically for an open class, have different fish of the month and an open class every month, tank only classes. We chose to update the fish of the month and hold open classes every month as well. We need to get people comfortable with showing fish so one year we can have a show with our auction. Implement a ticket system to raffle off a prize at the end of the month. Prize could possibly be the donated filter. We can display the prize with the jar show to get people excited about what they could possibly win.

Monthly Programs: September: Ron Bishop - Showing. October - Charlie Drew - Breeding November - TBD December - Tom H - Making your own food. January - TBD February - TBD March - ponds?

April - Jun - TBD.

Possible talks include manufacturer reps, expeditions, filtration, marine fish, breeding, showing, workshop style meeting, "speed dating" to get to know other club members.

Tom H could do a workshop on food, Joe K could do a talk on filtration, Ken could do a talk on lighting and plants, Catherine could do a talk on Betas. Possible other talks on sea horses, frogs and ponds.

Advertising Fees: Need Roman to show us the books of who has paid and when. We need to create a list of who is advertising and when they are due to pay. Full page is \$150, Half a page is \$100. We can also accept donations of products for payment.

Website: Tom H will speak with Ken about getting the username and password from Ken so we can update our website.

Breeders Awards: Tom B has created a new "How To" article on what to do to earn a certificate; to be published in the SCAT. Dave Furness is now a part of the BAP committee. We can award certificates for different variations within the same species but points will only be given for the first kind in a species. Some changes in the rules for getting a plaque; to be published in the SCAT.

Tank and Stand Donation: We can sell it in our November auction so we get a better price on it. We might get more money if we piece out the tank and filters and other accessories separately.

New Business: Where do shrimp fit in with the BAP? Collect memberships in September. Ask the editor if there is anything she needs us to do to help her out.

Breeders Award Program



The basic steps for a breeder's award: (Revised September 2014)

1. Within approximately 2 to 3 weeks, (not more than a month, please), of a spawn or birthing, request verification by the BAP chair, or, by arrangement with the BAP chair, another member of the club (usually a committee member, at this

time, Dave Furness, or an executive member). Ordinarily, to qualify for a certificate, a spawn should consist of at least 10 fry which survive past the 3 month point. In rare cases, exceptions may be made, (such as allowing successive spawns to be combined to make up the ten), at the discretion of the BAP Committee.

2. Complete and submit a club spawning report — forms are available from the BAP Chair at meetings or by email attachment.

3. *Either* donate 6 fry or two sexable pairs, *(should be approx. 3 months or more old)*, to the club mini-auction **or** write an article for the newsletter, describing the care and breeding of the species concerned, **or** instead of writing, give a short oral and/or pictorial presentation at a club meeting. *(Let the President know in advance so he/she can put you on the agenda.)*

Certificates are granted for each specific species. Varieties of species do not qualify for additional points — ie.: red wag platy and gold platy or various colours of angels, etc.. wouldn't get more points if you have already received points for breeding another variety of those species.)

Points are assigned to each class of fish.

Plaques are awarded for the required number of spawns in each class. For example: Tetras & Characins – 4 distinct species for the basic plaque. (See '**Plaque Requirements**' for more information.)

Presentation of your certificates will be made at the club meetings. Credit and points earned will be printed in an upcoming newsletter. Once you have earned a certificate you may be listed in the next update of the CAOAC Breeders Directory.

CAOAC breeders awards may be earned through fish bred for club certification. These applications must be made by the February CAOAC meeting each year. Application forms and details of these awards are on the CAOAC web site. http://www.caoac.ca/awards.html

Anyone applying for a CAOAC award will be presented with their special certificate at the annual CAOAC convention in May. If you cannot attend, your certificate will be sent to the club.




