
Dear Friends of Africa's Children's Fund,

HOUSING PROGRAMS

In 2000, our first housing program was created when we purchased several acres of land South of the city of Atlanta near the airport.

This was the beginning of our providing low income housing to which we then added rapid rehousing, mortgage and rent assistance as well as sourcing housing for persons with specialized medical conditions.

To date, we have served 9,455 individuals and families with their housing needs.

BOOKS FOR CHILDREN

After a Civil War in Liberia, school age students were left without books and materials for learning. The first 40 foot container filled with books and instructional manuals donated from Metro Atlanta schools and colleges was shipped in 1994.

Since the program began, Africa's Children's Fund has shipped books, purchased desks and assisted with the repair and building of schools throughout Nigeria and South Africa.

This educational program gave way for our Project EXCEL which began in 1995. We partnered with local school districts in Atlanta to create after-school and summer enrichment classes.

FOOD PROGRAMS

Providing foods for orphans in Haiti, Nigeria and other countries was our first food program which began in 2001.

Since then our Bags of Hope Campaigns have expanded our reach and allowed us to have provided meals during special times of celebration, distributed bags of and boxes of food during the pandemic, offer gift cards for food to families that we are assisting through our other programs and to provide school lunches when schools were not in session in Dekalb County.

Our partnerships have included organizations in the Bahamas and Nigeria.

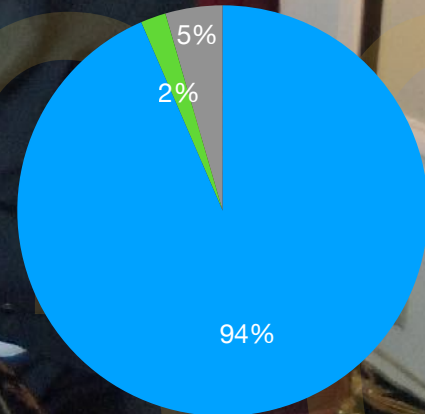

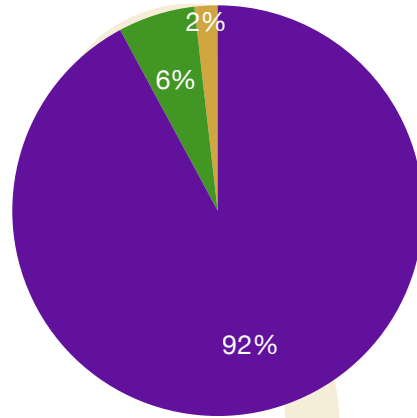
