Bob Dylan's 1978 lyrics echoed recently as a few residents report mail thefts, occasional car breakins, an aggressive solicitor, and other incidents that affect our well-being. The Old Bridge Police Department offers a crime prevention guide that offers pointers in all areas of home and personal safety. Here are just a few reminders to help us keep LWCA as safe as possible.

Labor Day BBQ

- Always lock your doors house, garage, and cars, even if you are out for only a few minutes. Do not leave valuables in your car,
- Leave spare keys in well-hidden places, not under doormats or above doorways.
- Keep your name off your door and mailbox. Avoid leaving notes on your door for friends or service people. Ask to see the credentials of any salespeople.



- Install outdoor lighting and trim shrubbery and bushes below your windows.
- Put outgoing mail in a USPS mailbox or deliver to Post Office. Do not place it in your mailbox for pickup. Bring in your mail and packages as soon as possible.
- Keep an eye out for your neighbors and report any suspicious activity. Let a neighbor know if you will be away.
- Use our closed Facebook group, www.facebook.com/groups/ lakeridgewest, to alert your neighbors of concerns. Other online township groups may be helpful in knowing what's happening elsewhere in Old Bridge.
