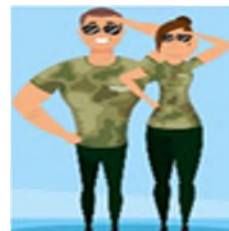
JANUARY 2026 VETERAN OF THE MONTH Congratulations ~John Thompson Jr.~
