







Dear Elks Lodge,

This letter is in regards to why I want to become a lineman. For a very long time I did not know what career path was right for me. Ever since we were little kids people always asked us what we wanted to be when we grew up, my answer was never clear. I did not have this inspiration and idea of what I wanted to be like all my friends.

I did however know my abilities and I knew what I wanted in a job. I knew I didn't want to go into work everyday and know exactly what to expect with little changes day-to-day. I wanted something exciting, something that would wake me up with curiosity of what the day held. I wanted a job that would allow me to travel and see new things, but still be close to home. I had A and B's all throughout school so I knew I could get into college, but I was never much for sitting in a classroom. I respect people who attend college and I want my kids to be able to attend college, I just don't believe it is for me. Most importantly, I wanted a job that would allow me to support my family in the future. A job that we could all be proud of.

So there I was, a highschool junior with no idea what job I wanted to pursue. Through highschool I took three construction classes and a welding class at the Tennessee College of Applied Technology. Due to Covid-19 I was unable to attend any more classes at the college. It was actually one of my brother's close friends that introduced me to the job of a lineman. I was shocked, here it was this job that had everything I was looking for and more. Becoming a lineman seemed to be the perfect fit for me. I immediately started looking up requirements and schools I could go to train to become a lineman. I stayed up reading job descriptions and watching videos of linemen on the job. I even talk to a linemen that works at an electric company in my town about what I could do to better my chances of getting to work as a lineman for the company.

I started looking into the North American Lineman Training Center in McEwen Tennessee. I became worried when I talked to a friend who said it cost him around \$15,000 to attend the training center. The center is over an hour away so I would have to pay for living expenses to attend or drive there each day. I began to think my dream job was only going to be a dream. Thankfully, Columbia State Community College just opened a Lineman Program that only cost \$5,000 and was only thirty minutes away. Even though Columbia State is cheaper, my mother and I would still have to require a loan for support. It will give me all the certifications and training I need to achieve my dream job. As I stated earlier, I never had a clear answer to the question what do you want to be when you grow up. It was always a question mark that needed to be answered. Becoming a lineman is my answer, all the inspiration and desire to be something is now being directed into becoming a lineman. Now when I am asked the question what do you want to be after highschool, I can now clearly say I want to be a lineman.

Recently this last October, I was told we would have to move out of our home, that we were renting from a family member, by January. After many prayers, struggles with the bank, and trying to find a home, we were fortunate enough to have a woman agree to let us rent a house until closing. Sadly, with the new cost of living, house repairs, and other payments I am scared I will not be able to support _____ fully through the lineman program. _____ is a hard worker who has maintained a part time job through high school while also playing football and keeping A/B grades. I, as well as all parents, wish the best for my children and know that an education for a career sets a solid foundation for achieving a more financially stable life.
