I wanted to share more information regarding the notice you should have received detailing the motion and voting for the property adjacent to our building, which Dr. White owns. That motion allows us to purchase the property for a couple of key reasons: Parking – that property gives us 10 spots for our busy times and weekends; we have had access to that parking for a couple of years in exchange for maintaining the property's grounds. Dr. White allowed us to install the key card gate for both security and access. Rental Income – We intend to use the property as additional rental income, as we do the salon now. And this will increase our footprint property-wise to help secure the future of our lodge. The Board of Directors has been diligently working on this project for several months, with the help of Lee Helton. Both Matt Brownfield and Earl Howell have been providing legal advice and direction to ensure that we follow the Grand Lodge guidelines for the purchase. After the Vote on June 3rd, the required paperwork will be submitted to Grand Lodge for final approval. At that time, we can schedule the closing and begin the preparations on the property for rental.

MOTION REGARDING PURCHASE OF ADJACENT DENTIST PROPERTY

Pursuant to Section 16.050 of the Statutes of the Order, the undersigned moves that the Lodge approve the following:

- (a) The purpose of the expenditure is to purchase the property at 1075 Graysville Road, referred to as the "Dentist Office," adjacent to our Lodge #91 property
- (b) The cost to be expended is \$250,000.00, being the purchase price for the property, plus closing costs of \$1,500.00.
- (c) No indebtedness will be incurred.
- (d) There will be no mortgage to secure the debt.
- (e) Persons authorized to act for the Lodge will be Secretary Reeda Hall, Treasurer Pam Cobb, Exalted Ruler Bill Cobb, and Leading Knight Mary Snellgrove, who may consult with and be assisted by legal counsel, including but not limited to, Mathew D. Brownfield and Earl Howell.
- (f) No amount will be received by the Lodge, but only the adjacent property.
