Read how Anna struggles to fight for justice, and deal with her personal issues from having been betrayed and abused by her husband of 13 years.




With the political stability of Europe hanging in the balance and the lives of those he loves in jeopardy, Peter desperately works to foil the plot and escape with his life.

# Melina Druga- 1914





# Jakob Halskov- Ripples in the Waters by Lake Kawaguchi



# Libraries and Librarian Support

The American Library Association (ALA) has created a clearing house of resources to assist library workers and advocates, when faced with censorship or book challenges. For more information on this, you can go to <https://www.ala.org/advocacy/fight-censorship>



Libraries face many challenges from censorship to the challenging of materials that are kept put on the bookshelves. Many times someone will try to remove certain books about certain topics that they disagree with from the library shelves.




According to the US Constitution, the First Amendment freedoms protect Libraries. The attempt to remove library materials based on its content is in violation of the first amendment, and constitutes censorship.

There is a trend of challenging books, and not just from school libraries, but also public libraries. According the ALA, in 2022, more than 681 challenges to over 1600 book titles. Lately, the main topics of challenges have to do with racism, African-American culture, and LGBTQ+ community. Some titles have always been on the list of banned books, especially classic titles by authors, such as Walt Whitman, George Orwell, William Shakespeare, and J.D Salinger, just to name a few.

Every year the ALA has a Banned book Week, and the next Banned Books Week will be October 1 - 7, 2023. But readers don't have to wait until then to still advocate for Freedom of Speech, and allowing people, especially adults to read what they want to read. It should be up to parents to decide for themselves and their children, what is read. A child who reads, grows up with the thirst of learning, and this should not be confined, which can cause ignorance, or even illiteracy.





# Jessica Herthel and Jazz Jennings - I Am Jazz

About the Book:

Genre: LGBTQA2S

The story of a transgender child based on the real-life experience of Jazz Jennings, who has become a spokesperson for transkids everywhere

From the time she was two years old, Jazz knew that she had a girl's brain in a boy's body. She loved pink and dressing up as a mermaid and didn't feel like herself in boys' clothing. This confused her family, until they took her to a doctor who said that Jazz was transgender and that she was born that way. 
Requirements for both lists:

# Literary Illiteracy Today

Illiteracy refers to someone who does not have enough knowledge in a particular subject, reading, finances, and other topics, like information, critical thinking, and even scientific.

Literary illiteracy means that someone cannot read or write. There are some adults that are functional illiterates, where they can read under a six-grade level. Illiteracy happens when someone does not get enough education, including elementary and subsequent schooling. This could be a result of dropping out of school. Also, if reading isn't put as an importance of a person, growing up, and not having exposure to books. There are instances of illiteracy because a person is disabled or has a learning disability, such as dyslexia. If a child is not diagnosed with a learning disability or tested for one, they may shy away from trying to read, or even learning, and give up.

According to the US Department of Education, “nearly 130 million American adults read below a sixth-grade level.” (<https://www.ed.gov/>). Children that have trouble reading, or do not read, can grow up to be adults who can't read or write.

The National education statistics “Report Card” on reading levels and abilities (updated 2020), is located at <https://nces.ed.gov/programs/coe/indicator/cnb> . “At grade 4, the average reading score in 2019 (220) was lower than the score in 2017 (222), when the assessment was last administered, but it was higher than the score in 1992 (217). Similarly, at grade 8 the average reading score in 2019 (263) was lower than the score in 2017 (267), but it was higher than the score in 1992 (260).”

The functioning persons who can't read or write at all, or can just read or write a little bit, can learn how to "fake" their ability to not read. Being illiterate, does not mean that someone is not intelligent or is ignorant, just that they may need help learning to read and write. Not everyone who can't read or write, wants to read or write, and thinks they can get by with excuses. Even family members may not realize that someone in their family cannot read or write.

Along with learning to read and write, there is the comprehension of what has been read or written. With (According to Google) over 129,864,880 books been written, published since 1440, reading and books have been a major part of people's lives. There should not be shame in noting being able to read, but be brave to ask for help.


Early learning is imperative. Parents should read to their children, children should learn and read to their parents. If the parent is

embarrassed that they can't read well out loud (and there's a difference from not being able to read at all or very little), they can find other outlets to help read to their children. Even just telling stories, and getting your children excited about reading stories, and learning new things.

I personally believe that everyone, no matter how old you are, how well you do or don't read, should read some children's books. There are a lot of books that teach people how to read, the sounds of the alphabet, and also books that teach lessons that everyone should be reminded of.

If someone you know cannot read, or needs help learning, it's not that hard to lend a helping hand, or point them in a direction where they can get help.

You can find information about literacy programs at your local library or schools, and even the US Department of Education. Reading is fundamental, and it is a right that we all have, if we just had someone to help.

# Writing 101

## Creating an Amazon Central Author Page

Authors, if your books are selling on Amazon.com, one thing you should do is to create an amazon author page. You don't have to be an Indie Author using the Kindle Publishing features of Amazon, you just need to be an author. This page allows you to have all of your books (even if it's just one) in one place for the buyer.

**Creating an Author Page** (This information is for Amazon US site only. I'll have a separate article for International sites).

If you have an amazon.com account (for buying or selling), and you use the same credentials to create your amazon author account. If you don't have an amazon.com account, you must create one of those first, and then can come back and create the author page. On the home page of Author Central, create an account by clicking on the "Join Now" button. Follow the instructions of creating your account.



(If you are an author with more than one penname, you'll need separate accounts for each penname). I have three, so I have three different author central accounts.

"Welcome to Author Central"

Once you get to the author central page, take the time and read all the information. It also provides links to other features that Amazon offers, and this can be especially helpful for those who use (or want to use) Kindle Publishing or ACX (Audio publishing).

The "Author Page" tab is where an author enters their information. The biography area lets the author tell the world (or buyers) about themselves. I personally write it in third person, but it's up to anyone on what they want to share and how they want to share it.

## Creating an Amazon Central Author Page

### Author Page:

The URL for your author page has a default setting, but it can be changed to fit an appropriate URL, but this can only be changed once.

**Blog:** If you have an blog that is related to your writing, you can share it here, but only if you have an RSS feed available from your blog provider. You can add several blogs. I currently linked this blog (my author blog) and Amy's Bookshelf Review Blog.

**Photos:** The photo is what you want people to see when they visit your amazon central page. You upload it from your computer.

**Events** allows authors to share information about different events.

The video section allows authors to upload videos from their computer, and the videos should be appropriate, and related to your books or writing. It has to be uploaded, not embedded from video websites.

### The "Books" Tab

It's obvious what is added here, the books. The purpose of the page is to add books and link them to the author. If this is a first time creation, the book titles can be added here. The book first **MUST BE PUBLISHED** or available for **PREORDER**. Click on "Add More Books" and then search for the book. The easiest way is by ISBN, since authors or titles may be similar. Once the book is found, click on "This is my book" underneath the title. Kindle Books and Paperback books are listed separately. Once a book is published, if you have separate editions that are not automatically linked together, then you need to contact Amazon via the help features of Amazon for them to combine the editions.

Once the books are listed, the author can see if or how many reviews the title has, update information, such as adding

reviews" or additional information about the book, such as excerpts or other information that is appropriate for the title of each section. If there isn't anything in the section, it does not appear on the book page.

### Ranks

The sales info tab gives details about sales and rankings, and Customer reviews allows the author to see all reviews for all titles.

### Author Page:

There are many author pages on Amazon for those to get an idea of how to put together an amazon page. Here is the link to mine (<https://www.amazon.com/Amy-Shannon/e/B00EFZD5NU>) use it as a sample page.

# Authors Need Reviewers

Authors need reviews just as much as anyone who sells their goods and services. Readers look at reviews before reading books, and selecting something, especially if it is from an unknown author. Readers are always looking for their next read, and many like myself, love reading from authors that I've never read before, or someone I've never heard about until I saw their book.

There are not a lot of professional reviewers. Some famous review companies charge for their reviews, and that charge is because they have been in business a long time, and they have a reputation. They don't just read any book, they are selective of what they read. Paying for a review is not necessarily a bad thing, but if you do, you are looking to make it an investment, as many review companies charge over \$200.



As authors, we cannot rely on just readers to read and then review their book. Readers may read, but they don't always think about reviewing. Authors should look for reviewers, but don't just select anyone, research what they are looking for in a book, and also make sure they review your genre.

As a professional reviewer, I do not charge for reviews, but offer promotions and other things that may require a donation. I am one of the reviewers that will tell the author when the review has been posted, and give a copy of the review. There are also many different book blog tour companies, with reasonable rates, that will not just promote your book, but also gather reviewers to read and review your work.

## Authors Need Reviewers (Cont'd)

Book blog tour companies also rely on reviewers, and those who commit to reading and review the book, to actually read and review the book, and post it. Most book blog tour companies don't pay their reviewers, unless they are part of that company's staff, but they do provide free books, and of course, the reviewers can gain attention when their reviews are posted on social media.



If you're a reader, do the author a favor and write a review. They can use it for selling and promoting their work. If you're a book blogger, book reviewer, or just someone who likes to read free books, and will be willing to write a review, contact some book blog tour companies, and offer to help.


## The Coldest War Lies Within


# Kaye D. Schmitz- The Road Renounced
