
The Mike Stoneman Thriller Series
















Alison McBain- The New Empire

I enjoyed it so much, that I have now followed the author and look for more books to read. Alison was also a guest on our podcast and we were honored with her reading an excerpt to the book. For The New Empire, the reader is introduced to Jiangxi, a very interesting and powerfully raw character. I recommend reading the book from the title page all the way to the end. There is important information that the reader should know before diving into the story. May times the Prologue gives insight and some foreshadowing for what is to come. Jiangxi's story shows a tragic and tormented childhood, being a branded slave, only to survive a journey that most of the children around him, did not. One of the things the reader will most see during the reading of the story, is that the story is written in Mutsun Language, which makes some words have spaces, such as Th e. I found this added a realism to the story and shows how much the author took the time for research. He lived as a slave to the Onas, and had interaction with neighbors, but they rarely spoke to him. He was fortunate that sometimes, he had time to himself, which he "would run through the woods as he had on that day when he had seen the kuksui's mask and fled in fear. But instead of fear, he tasted anticipation—his speed had purpose..."

It was a very remarkable and inspiring story, and Jiangxi was one of a Chinese slave, but a slave, nonetheless. This is one of those books that grabs you from the start and pulls you in. Breathtaking! Compelling! This journey was very unpredictable. What an inspirational title. The title drew me in, but the story made me stay.







Matt Cost- Velma Gone Awry



Jarvis Mann is magnetic.



Colonial Parkway is a historic road, in the Tidewater regions of Virginia's National Park. The authors are a father and daughter team, not just talking about these eight cases of the murder of young persons. There were three couples murdered, and another couple missing and presumed to be dead. The time frame and the locations of the murders are what linked the murders, unofficially. These are still unsolved crimes. The authors not only put a new spotlight on these murders, but also open up files, and investigate on their own, and interview families. 

To evade the law, he goes to Europe and ends up in Israel where he works on a Kibbutz, touching the hem of his Jewish heritage.

A very interesting insight into the life of Michael Hardy

David Larson writes about Michael Hardy, an infamous Jewish Gangster in THE LAST JEWISH GANGSTER: The Middle Years I am a fan of true crime stories. This is the first book written by this author that I've read. Michael Hardy was a twisted criminal, in the life of organized crime. This story tells about his life in the late 1960's. He went to prison after confessing to a crime committed by his mother. Some say it hardened him, more, but at the time, all he wanted was some respect and affection from his mother. 

Reviews: The ins and outs of getting reviewed

Reviews can come in different forms, such as from a reader who buys the book, loves it/hates it, needs the world to know whether to buy it or not.

Or from your mother, father, sister, brother, etc. who will write that they love it, whether they do or not.

Or, your best friend, who is always brutally honest and not afraid to tell you what he/she thought!

Or, from a reader, who borrowed the book from one of her/his friends, needs to tell the world they loved it, hated it, or something in between.

Or, from a book reviewer that the author probably seeks out, and they will write a review, honest and unbiased.

Yes, pretty much anyone can write a review, and write what they want to write about it.

Now, as an author, you are sharing "your baby" with someone else other than yourself. It takes a lot of courage to share your work with someone, AND to listen to what they have to say.

If you're going to seek out reviewers, DO YOUR HOMEWORK/RESEARCH or whatever you want to call it. You can find reviewers on Amazon.com (just look at the reviews, click on their names, and see their profile, if they are avid



review writers). If they write reviews a lot, see what kind of genres they read, and how they write their reviews. (It's not easy to say, but some ALWAYS write Negative (2 or 1 star reviews) and some ALWAYS write 5-Star Reviews.

Look for (or search on Google or whatever your favorite search engine is) and look for Review Directories. (I have one on my Bookshelf Review page, which I am still building). Look for reviewers that are (1) still active, (2) read your genre or read ANY genre and then check out their website/blog or wherever they post their review.

Read their review policy, their request policy, and even turnaround time if it's there. (On my blog, I keep a list of the Titles I have to review, so authors can see their status). Also, see if they have a contact policy. Some you leave your request, give them your book, and never hear from them again, so you have to keep looking to see if a review was posted. My blog, I answer every email I get within 72 hours (most of the time it's under 48 hours).

Yes, Yes, Yes, reviews are important. Some readers look to them to see if they would be interested in your book. Personally, I read the reviews after I posted my own, to see what others thought.

Creating an Amazon Central International

Author Page

Authors, if your books are selling on Amazon.com, one thing you should do is to create an amazon author page. You don't have to be an Indie Author using the Kindle Publishing features of Amazon, you just need to be an author. This page allows you to have all of your books (even if it's just one) in one place for the buyer.

Amazon has several international selling/buying sites but there are only a few International sites that have Author Central Pages. Note that most of them are written in their native language, so unless you speak that language, you will need to have the page translated. Google Chrome will translate foreign language websites. All sites are set up like each other, so even without a translator, you can pretty much figure out what it says.

Creating an Author Page

First, to set up an International Author Page, an amazon international site account needs to be created first.

On the home page of Author Central, create an account by clicking on the "Join Now" button. Follow the instructions of creating your account. (If you are an author with more than one penname, you'll need separate accounts for each penname). I have three, so I have three different author central accounts.

"Welcome to Author Central"

Once you get to the author central page, take the time and read all the information. It also provides links to other features that Amazon offers, and this can be especially helpful for those who use (or want to use) Kindle Publishing or ACX (Audio publishing).

Author Page:

International sites are slightly different in what features they have compared to the Amazon US site. The "Author Page" tab is where an author enters their information. The biography area lets the author tell the world (or buyers) about themselves. I personally write it in third person, but it's up to anyone on what they want to share and how they want to share it.

Creating an Amazon Central International Author Page

Photos: The photo is what you want people to see when they visit your amazon central page. You upload it from your computer.

Events allows authors to share information about different events.

The video section allows authors to upload videos from their computer, and the videos should be appropriate, and related to your books or writing. It has to be uploaded, not embedded from video websites.

The "Books" Tab

It's obvious what is added here, the books. The purpose of the page is to add books and link them to the author. If this is a first time creation, the book titles can be added here. The book first MUST BE PUBLISHED or available for PREORDER. Click on "Add More Books" and then search for the book. The easiest way is by ISBN, since authors or titles may be similar. Once the book is found, click on "This is my book" underneath the title. Kindle Books and Paperback books are listed separately. Once a book is published, if you have separate editions that are not automatically linked together, then you need to contact Amazon via the help features of Amazon for them to combine the editions.

Some books are listed automatically, but not all of them. So you may want to go through the list, and add as needed.

Once the books are listed, the author can see if or how many reviews the title has, update information, such as adding "reviews" or additional information about the book, such as excerpts or other information that is appropriate for the title of each section. If there isn't anything in the section, it does not appear on the book page.

When clicking on the different tabs in the Author Central area, if you are using Google Chrome, you'll have to click the translator icon for each page, or it won't translate

Ranks

The sales info tab gives details about sales and rankings, and Customer reviews allows the author to see all reviews for all titles.

Author Page:

There are many author pages on Amazon for those to get an idea of how to put together an amazon page.





Simple "W's"

Who? What? Where? When? Why?

I remember the five W's from fourth grade class, when we had to read a newspaper article (back when it was actual paper) and answer those questions about the story. I found that they can lend to a story in a way I didn't realize until I sat down to write this book.

Some writers use an outline, but me, I just don't. I like to write "outside of the outline." When I write my stories, I sit down and write until I must stop. I stop when I literally have to stop and think about the story. When that happens, I know it's time to walk away for a while. It doesn't mean that I don't get ideas and write them down, because I do. I write notes in notebooks, and I keep them by my bed, in my purse and a pile near my desk. Wherever I go, I have something to write on. Sometimes, if I'm driving and I get an idea, I'll ask my "Google Assistant" to send me a note. Then later, I figure out how to add the ideas to the story. Sometimes ideas are just simply putting together characters that will be added to the story (and there are those that get added as I go along.

The simple W's can be used to create individual characters, and even an entire story.

Who? Who is the character? This character is more than just a name on a page.

What? What is this character?
Occupation, especially if it affects the story. (Such as a doctor in a hospital, detective at a police station, private investigator, etc. Or the character is a killer or even a spirit or ghost.)

Where? Where does the character live, work, travel?

When? When does this character exist? Such as time frame, or era. Is this a character who time travels?

Why? Why does the character act and behave or do things a certain way? Some of the backstory may take place in "why."
