



Read how Anna struggles to fight for justice, and deal with her personal issues from having been betrayed and abused by her husband of 13 years.




Author Spotlight Bob Freeman

The author began writing SciFi in 2021 at the tender age of 70 and has published four short stories to date in various magazines as well as four volumes of the H2LiftShip saga.




















Author Spotlight Gary Orleck


Ed Borowsky's Lizard of Transition

Literate-Ly Magazine: Without quoting your back cover blurb, tell me about the last book you published.


Bob Freeman: The stories continue on the same vein as the previous three books, resolving the HiveWar with humor and algal burritos.




Yvonne deSousa- Shelter of the Monument: A Provincetown Love Story



David Grosz writes a intensely dramatic tale with Providence



A.J. Scudiere - Sabotage




Morgan St. James- Fatal Encounter


Nichole Heydenburg- Don't Look Inside


Nichole Heydenburg writes a thrilling tale for those 16 and older with Don't Look Inside




Ed Borowsky's The Great Mongolian Bowling League of the United States of America

Who do I write for?

Many times I peruse social media, and see many different statuses, some make my eyes roll, some make me laugh, and some just make me move on. However, when I see other authors post about writing, I usually stop and read what they have to say. I find that I have learned from other authors, what to write, what not to write, but also the mind set of other authors.

Today, I'm reading some posts in a Facebook group, and the writer wants to know what others like to read, so this writer can decide what to write.

I have a lot of opinions about how some perceive writing, and it's different from just someone say "I should write a book." If you're a writer and you know, just write. If you want to write a story, do it. See what happens. As a writer, we are taught in English class (I guess now they call it "ELA" for English Language Arts) to write what you know. I go one step further and write about what I want to know. Not only about the subject, but also my own writing skills and challenging myself as a writer and a person.



If you're going to write, write for yourself. Write what you want to write about, and what you would want to read about. I started writing in different genres so I could take a story and write how I would want it go, how I want it read, and took all my "pet peeves" of other writing styles and changed it, within my own story. Chances are if you like it, someone else will. Then you can worry about who your target audience would be and test it out.

Also, just because someone says they will read it, does not mean they will. It's not always easy to get that reader (or buyer) once it's written.

Gary Orleck's Travels With Maurice: An Outrageous European Adventure in 1968





Non-human Characters

Non-human characters can be anything from animals to aliens, to robots (or Artificial Intelligence) to even inanimate objects. A character needs to have the audience relate to attributes that show some part of humanity. I once read a story where the writer narrated the story as if it were coming from the perspective of a pet dog. It was a very interesting story, to see how the world looks from a dog's perspective. When a reader can relate to a character, no matter the type of character, and it can emote some type of emotion, even dislike, then the character has done its job. The character needs to grow even if the character isn't human. Think of that old 80's movie, Short Circuit, where a "robot" became a sentient being, or as he said, "Number 5 is alive."

If the non-human character is an animal, make sure that the description is that of the animal, and not a human. Example: a human has feet or hands, where a cat or dog would have paws, or a horse has hooves.

If the non-human character is an Artificial intelligence being (AI) or robot, the technical aspects of the being can be meshed with human like qualities.

For futuristic characters, or aliens (as used in fantasy or science fiction) give the character human-like qualities, along with some made up characteristics, such as the color of their skin, if they have scales or large horns protruding from a body part, or other types of descriptive features of the being.

Magical or fantasy "creatures" that are based on lure or mythology, or some fantasy story, such as unicorns, Pegasus, gryphons, dragons, or something to the like, make the character interesting, and not just the standard creature, such as a fire breathing dragon. I am a big fan of mythology, and though I don't write in that type of genre, I have utilized my knowledge by incorporating it within a story. (I had a serial killer leave cards that depicted mythological creatures or demigods).


Mary L. Schmidt- Her Alibi




Shattered: An Emily Graham Novel




