"The Language Development of the Child

When the child arrives in the Montessori classroom, he has fully absorbed his culture's language. He has already constructed the spoken language and with his entry into the classroom, he will begin to consolidate the spoken language and begin to explore the written forms of language. Because language is an integral involvement in the process of thinking, the child will need to be spoken to and listened to often. The child will need a broad exposure to language, with correct articulation, enunciation, and punctuation. The child will need to experience different modes of language and to hear and tell stories. Most importantly, the child needs to feel free and be encouraged to communicate with others. With the child's absorbent mind, the child by age six will have reached the 3rd point of consciousness in language where he understands that sounds and words have meaning and that these symbols can be used in writing. He will become fully articulate, he will be able to express himself in writing, he will be able to read with ease, and have a full comprehension of the thoughts of others.

The Prepared Environment

To help the child in his development in language, the Montessori classroom is designed to help the child reach the 3rd period of consciousness. Because the learning of language is not done through subjects as in a normal classroom, the child is learning at his own rhythm. This allows the child to concentrate on the learning of each important step in language so that each progressive step is done easily and without any thought on the part of the child. The special material also plays an important role in aiding the child develop the powers of communication and expression, of organization and classification, and the development of thought.

But the most important tool in the child's learning of language lies within the directress. She must support the child in his learning, give him order to classify what he has learned, to help the child build self-confidence, and to provide the child with meaningful activities. The directress is the child's best source in language development.

Language Completions of the First Plane

As the child leaves the Montessori classroom after the age of six, he will have become an articulate person, being able to communication his feelings in well-formed sentences and in writing. He will be able to write these thoughts and feelings in a skillful handwriting. He will have the ability to write in different styles and about a variety of subjects. The child will have total reading and a sense of the home language at a level where he will be the master of his words."

December was a fast month, filled with excitement and anticipation if Santa was going to be able to bring gifts this year.

Our **Cultural** unit of study was learning about the eight nights of Hanukkah and how and why it is celebrated, learning to play the dreidel game and the traditional foods that are eaten for this holiday. Then Christmas around the world. We visited France, Germany, Italy, Sweden, Australia, Canada, and Mexico. We learned Santa's name in other languages. P'ere Noel, Babbo Natale, Father Christmas, and Jultomten. The class discussed different foods they ate compared to other traditional holiday foods. In some countries Christmas is celebrated all week with different events leading up to Christmas Eve. Some children put their shoes outside to receive gifts instead of hanging Christmas Stockings. This was a fun unit, especially Australia where it is Summer now. Barbeques, picnics, swimming and surfing along with gifts is the Australian way of celebrating!

Botany: The children learned the difference between Deciduous and Evergreen trees. Which tree loses its leaves in the winter and which ones have needles? What are Conifer trees? (to be continued).

Science: We started on the Layers of the Earth unit with an introduction to rocks and minerals. Due to all the holiday activities, we will continue this unit in January along with an excavation. What gem will you find?

Zoology: Animal tracks and what do animals do in the winter? What is hibernation and migration?

January Units of Study: We will be learning about the Polar Regions with an emphasis on Alaska and the cold environment. Alaskan animals, and yes, Antarctic Penguins. The Inuit people, Igloos, and the beautiful Northern lights. In the beginning of March, we will visit and track the Iditarod race including the 2021 teacher on the trail. What a great unit to look forward to. We will also acknowledge Martin Luther King Jr. and his Dream.

Botany: Conifer trees, means "cone bearer". What does that mean? Fun facts about pinecones. We will also learn about some winter plants and which can flower during the cold weather.

Science: We will be learning about the Solar System. Do we or do we not have 9 planets? Our galaxy, the sun, stars, and the moon. What are scientists saying now? We will also learn about snowflakes. Are they the same or different? What determines their size? With this comes crystal experiments and projects using gem and minerals

We are looking forward to a safe second semester with lots of fun projects, celebrations, and learning!

Geography: This month we will journey to the polar regions with a special focus on Alaska. Our goal for this study is for the child to understand the differences between the north and south pole. Where are they? What lives there? Are there any similarities?

Botany: Our class seems to really love pinecones! Nurturing their love of the pinecone we will be discussing conifers and deciduous trees. It just so happens that the state tree of Alaska is the Sitka spruce. Do not be surprised if you hear a few fun facts about the Sitka spruce!

Science: We will learn about and experiment with snow. Since we cannot count on New Mexico to cooperate we will start with a fake snow science experiment followed by making crystals and attempt a snowstorm in a cup. As always, it is best to dress appropriately for science day. Good news is that snow is white so how bad could it possibly be?

Cultural: Our cultural studies will coincide with our study on Alaska. We will learn about the Inuit people and how they live today.

Language: With this unit you can expect to hear some great new vocabulary words; Northern lights, Iditarod, toboggan, Malamutes, Juneau, dendrite, blizzard, and glacier just to name a few! Can you tell we are excited? This is going to be so much fun!
