Toddler Class News

Wow! What an amazing couple of months. The children have adjusted to the new routine. They are excited about the new lessons being presented in circle and eager to work with the new materials. As a class we are working on grace and courtesy focusing on care of self and of the environment. We are also working on being calm and peaceful in the classroom and being kind and respectful to others.

During the month of February we learned about reptiles, the parts of a turtle and various dinosaurs. The Toddlers have enjoyed learning different songs and doing weekly art projects that focus on what we are learning.

We have introduced practical life work for spooning, pouring, sorting, rolling, folding, and flower arranging. We have also introduced new manipulative materials. The practical life and manipulative materials help the children to build focus and strengthen their fine motor skills in preparation for reading and writing.

In March we will be learning about amphibians, the parts of a frog, the life cycle of the frog, and about spring. We will be continuing individual lessons on some of the basic sensorial and math materials while working with the children to become more focused during one on one lessons.

Welcome to March! In February, the transition class studied reptiles and dinosaurs. We also focused on several materials in our sensorial area studying both shapes and geometric solids. The children have now taken a special interest in the shape of their lunch containers. We talked about our teeth, how to take care of them, and had a dentist visit with her very special alligator assistant! Our Valentine's Day celebration was full of discussions about giving, which ties right into Lunar New Year and the tradition of giving good luck tokens. We read several stories about Abraham Lincoln and practiced speaking up for what is right. The transition class was also very excited to have their parents come in and observe their works during student presentations. In the upcoming month we will study amphibians and different types of land forms. As we move into spring it will be a perfect time to observe and track our local weather patterns! 3-6 Class News

We truly appreciate all of you who showed up to February's Parent Education night and hope that it helped you to gain insight into the philosophy of the Montessori Method and environment. It was also nice to see the Students giving you a demonstration of how they make the materials and the classroom their own with their presentations. It is amazing to see how much they have all grown in such a short time!

Unit Studies: Botany:

As we shake off the winter blues and start to see the trees budding, the Class will start to explore the parts of the tree. They will learn all new vocabulary and will also be looking at the parts on our various school trees along with new works that will better connect the abstract concept with the concrete. Toward the end of March, when the more plentiful warmth bears the first buds of spring, we will begin our unit on the parts of a flower. The students have already seen some of the sunflower seeds they planted in the garden beds sprout!

Cultural:

February was a very cultural study rich month for the class. We began with the observation of Black History Month and a discussion that has continued over the weeks. The Class has learned about many figures in our Country's history, including Harriet Tubman and Frederick Douglass, who helped to shape the lives of everyone with their heroic efforts. There was also a study of Chinese New Year and the customs surrounding it, and the significance of the Year of the Dog. Finally, we looked at why Americans celebrate President's day by presenting the lives of two important Presidents, George Washington and Abraham Lincoln, both born in February. March will also be a time to observe Women's History month by sharing the lives of some of the people who worked to improve conditions of women in the US and across the world.

Geography:

Students will travel to South America in their study of the continent and the people that make up such a diverse and culturally immense area of our planet. They will get a chance to hear some music and see some of the many differences and similarities between the many countries. We will also present some of the basics of landforms to the children, which will allow them to see the terrain around them in a whole new light.

Zoology:

Snakes, Skinks, Salamanders, and Toads and all things that slither and inhabit our world with bodies much different from Class Mammalia. February brought a unit of study on Reptiles with a particular look at our exothermic friend the turtle and its parts. We also compared and contrasted the characteristics of other types of animals we learned about with those of Reptiles. During March we will check out the somewhat alike Amphibians, many of who have been dormant during this time of the year in our hemisphere.

Science:

February and March will be in part dedicated to one landform that both intrigues and threatens humans, the volcano. Students will get to learn about the parts of the volcano, the conditions for eruption and the differences between magma and lava. This will conclude with a special outdoor construction of their very own volcanoes (complete with vegetation and to tie in with our unit on Reptiles, dinosaurs) that will erupt with the power of baking soda, red food color and vinegar. March will also be devoted to looking at the many types of weather phenomenon that is experienced around the world and locally.

<u>Art:</u>

Along with the unit on weather, or more particularly wind, the class will be working on making kites. Seeing that we've had no shortage of windy days so far, the children will hopefully get a kick out of seeing the power of weather in action and one of the ways it can affect our lives in a fun way!
