The Practical Life area of the classroom is designed to help children gain control and develop independence for themselves.

Practical Life covers Control of Body, Care of Environment, Care of Self, and Grace & Courtesy as listed below.

These lessons also begin the process for a child to focus and concentrate, which will benefit them when they begin the more academic work.

Montessori Practical Life Checklist

Preliminary Exercises

walking around the mat standing quietly sitting down and getting up from the floor sitting down and getting up from a chair carrying a chair carrying a table

Primary Lessons

Scholastic Reading Club



<u>Pumpkin patch</u>: What a picture-perfect day it turned out to be. The children seemed to have fun running through the corn maze looking for the flags to punch their map cards. I'm not sure how many looked at the corn growing. On to the pumpkin patch, where big decisions needed to be made, which pumpkin do I really want to take home? Finally, name on the pumpkin, it's yours and we are ready for the hayride. A quick stop to see the animals, lunch and running around with friends. It was nice to see our families gathering together, introducing I am ... mother, father or grandparent. Thank you for a lovely morning.

Units of Studies:

Cultural: October started with learning the parts of a hot air balloon (in celebration of the balloon fiesta). The children watched the process of blowing up a balloon using an acid and a base. Lots of fiction and non-fiction books, pictures and of course balloon cards to enhance the beauty of this magical time in Albuquerque, New Mexico. (acknowledging our city and state) November teachings will focus on the countries of North America and the First Thanksgiving. The children will share what they are grateful for.

Botany: We explored the parts of a leaf, learned two new words and their meanings. *Chlorophyll* and *Photosynthesis*. We will be experimenting with color mixing by doing several science experiments and hands on materials will be available for the children to explore. Watch for the leaves turning colors. November studies will be parts of a tree and what functions they play in our environment.

Science: We have studied the terminology related to the human skeleton. In doing so, we learned we have 206 bones in our body. We also enjoyed fun activities that helped us remember the name of our bones. The children had a lot of fun with the song; skull, clavicle, scapula etc.! Ask them to sing it to you. Best word, phalanges!! Our continued studies in November will be parts of our inner body and their functions.

Zoology: In studying the parts of the horse, the children thought it was funny that we (humans) were classified as mammals. We learned the parts of the horse and talked about various mammals including the unlikely; Dolphins/Whales, Bats, and an Armadillo to name some. November studies will be the classification and parts of a Bird.

In November we are looking forward to you observing your child's presentation of his/her works and look forward to discussing their development during Parent/Teacher Conferences.

Dear Parents,

It's officially Fall! Our class will be busy exploring parts of the body and the world around us. We are looking forward to parent teacher conferences where we will get the opportunity to discuss your child's social and academic progress. Please be on the lookout for the signup sheet.

Botany:

With the cooler weather we are finally seeing the leaves change color. This gives us the opportunity to investigate parts of a leaf, and why leaves change color.

Cultural:

In November, we will discuss the first Thanksgiving and how the Native American tribes helped the first English settlers survive their new environment. We will also learn about and take a closer look at Native American tribes that live closer to us.

Geography:

For Geography, we will be looking closer to home. Where in the world do we live? North America, United States, New Mexico, and Albuquerque. We will do our best to make sense of it all!

Zoology:

This season we will begin our study of birds. This will include learning the parts of a bird and how birds prepare for winter.

Science:

Our goal in science is to encourage the children to ask questions, explore, investigate and conclude. If it seems as if our experiments are all over the place, it's probably because they are! When a child asks a "what if" question we do our best to match that question to a hands-on experiment. Most of all we hope these experiments are fun! We will continue to do our best to send you pictures in the mykidzday app.

Language and Math:

Each child is on an individualized language and math plan. We will discuss this further with you during parent teacher conferences.

We look forward to seeing you on Friday, November 15th for student presentations!

Fall is here and the weather is changing! It's amazing how quickly this semester is going by. The children are doing great and we are becoming more and more normalized as a class. This time of the year is so much fun. The pumpkin patch was a great community event and it was nice to see the children out of the school environment, enjoying a beautiful day outdoors.

October has been filled with so much learning and discovering!

Science: we have been investigating how our skeleton is surrounded by muscles and controlled by our nervous system.

Botany: we have introduced the parts of a leaf and had fun collecting different leaves for our observation tray. We have been talking about the season change and how the leaves have started to change color and fall from the trees.

Art: the children enjoyed learning about hot air balloons and decorating their own. They also enjoyed making and working with homemade play dough during our Art Enrichment time.

In November, we will continue our botany study on leaves and learn about the names of different kinds of trees that they come from.

Zoology: we will be learning about the parts of the bird and with a focus on the feathers.

We have recently introduced different forms of transportation. Sorting where various forms of transportation travel on the land, in the air or in the water.

Some changes have been made to our daily routine. We are conducting circle time before lunch, starting lunch at 11:15am and then going outside. The change allows us to have a longer, uninterrupted work cycle with less transition as well as giving the children a little more time to run around before getting picked up or going down for rest time.

We are looking forward to meeting with you during the upcoming Parent Teacher Conferences. Prior to conferences, we are asking that you drop in November 19th – November 21st between 9:30 – 10:30 am to observe your child working in the classroom. <u>This is in leu of "Student</u> *Presentations" on November 15th*.
