Why Sensorial Work is Important -

"Sensorial activities are used in Montessori learning to help children in discrimination and order. They also help broaden and refine a child's senses. When a child combines Montessori designed materials with sensorial work, it helps them become more logical, perceptive, and aware.

Dr. Montessori developed the concept of sensorial work long before sensory play was put into practice. In Montessori philosophy, the child is considered the "sensorial explorer" and learns to perceive qualities through sensorial experiences."

Dear Parents, Wow! What a great beginning to the start of a New Year, and second semester! We are glad to report that we are back on track and ready to forge ahead. We would like to thank you for your thoughtful gifts that will enhance our classroom, extra bonus gifts and your warm Holiday Greetings.

What an amazing Holiday Concert the children delivered! Thank you for attending!

Units of Study: This month in our cultural units we will discuss Martin Luther King Jr., and his "Dream." The children will expand on the possibilities of harmony and peace among people. Through problem solving and role play we will foster compassion and understanding of citizenship, and how to be a peaceful member of our classroom. February is filled with holidays. We'll start the month with Ground Hog Day and learn if Punxsutawney Phil see his shadow or not!

In Cultural: A visit to the continent of Asia with an emphasis on China. We'll discuss the traditions of the Chinese New Year and learn our Chinese zodiac sign. Valentine's Day is always a special day of sharing, caring and learning how the holiday was named. President's Day brings the studies of Abraham Lincoln and George Washington. We will discuss the job a President does, and how we have similar "laws" at school. We will learn about Rosa Parks, Harriett Tubman, and Jackie Robinson for Black History month.

In Zoology: We have been discovering Antarctica. We began the unit with an emphasis on the live cycle of the Emperor Penguins. The children are fascinated by how the father takes the egg from the mother penguin and cares for it on his feet for two months, without eating, meanwhile the mother penguin journeys back to sea to eat and bring back food for the chick. We learned the difference between the Adélie penguins and the Emperor penguins. Some other penguins we talked about are the Macaroni, Rockhopper and the Fairy, which is the smallest penguin.

Our next unit is reptiles. We will learn the classification of a reptile and study the parts of a turtle. We cannot study reptiles without learning about the dinosaurs who roamed our earth. The children have so much to share with this unit so it will continue into March.

<u>In Science</u>: In January, we did some experiments growing crystals and looking at salt and sugar with a magnifying glass. The children discovered that the salt is shaped like cubes while the sugar crystals are irregular shapes. We also made our own snow and moon dust.

February is National Dental month and we will have a speaker visit to talk about caring for our teeth. In class, we will learn how many baby and adult teeth we have, the names of our teeth, parts of a tooth and their function. We have new hands on materials for the children to explore which will enhance their learning.


What makes up the solar system, our galaxy, the order of the planets including Pluto, and what they are made of? We will review the inner earth which will lead to our study of volcanoes and tie in nicely with our dinosaur activities.

Language: Each child is on their own individual path to becoming a reader. In group we do a sound of the week and are working on short a blending. If your child is a reader and takes home a book from the Jan and Pam series, please make sure you allow them to read to you at home. Some of the most difficult words are the "sight words". Repetition and practice will help to build confidence.
