

Running Your Race: Here Comes Encouragement and Enthusiasm

Remember, we are not alone in this Christian journey! God, in His infinite wisdom, understands our struggles. When we find it challenging to fulfill our calling, He graciously provides someone, whether near or far, to uplift and inspire us for the path ahead.

When I feel challenged, burdened, and sometimes dismayed, I turn to 1 Timothy 4 in the Scriptures. This chapter tells a story of leadership, camaraderie, responsibility, caring, and love that constantly reminds us that we are never abandoned and always held in God's enduring love.

You, too, may have your flame refueled as you lean into this chapter and encounter the (cont'd on next page)

(cont'd) apostle Paul in another one of his roles as an encourager.

In 1 Timothy, Paul leaves Timothy, his young protégé, to develop and manage the newly established church in Ephesus, but he does not leave him to fend for himself in his new assignment.

Paul, a seasoned leader in the faith, understands the challenges of leading others to Christ. He writes to Timothy not just to give advice but to strengthen him and set an example for the brothers in the church. This guidance is for Timothy and all of us who are called to lead in our faith.

As you read verse 5, it's clear that Paul wants Timothy to understand the importance of steadfast faith and purpose. He wants him to be prepared for the challenges that may come, to stand firm when others stray, and to remain resolute in his belief and purpose. Paul's message to Timothy is a call to determination, a reminder that we must stay focused and unwavering in our faith and purpose.

He wants to reassure Timothy that when he points out certain things to the brothers, he will do so confidently and firmly. They will see him as a good minister of Christ Jesus, staying true to the faith and encouraging others to do the same (4:6). Paul knows that encouragement flows downhill. By reassuring Timothy, he will remain focused on his purpose and reject the distractions, as we need to believe and stay focused on our purpose.

In verse 7, Paul gives us a powerful reminder. He encourages Timothy, and by extension, all of us, to stay away from godless myths and instead train ourselves to be godly. As Paul says, godliness has value for all things, giving us a positive outlook on our present life and the life to come.

As we see in verse 9, there is no shortage of encouragement to build Timothy's enthusiasm when Paul further reminds Timothy that their hope is entirely in the living God. How do we rate ourselves in this essential area of Christian life and belief? Are we encouraging others to grow in their belief of where to place their hope?

Are we teaching those things so that others can grow stronger, as Paul emphasizes to Timothy what he needs to do in verse 11? He tells Timothy he must be an example and set an example for the believers. How are we running our race so far

Knowing that encouragement defeats thoughts of lack and creates enthusiasm, Paul challenges Timothy to set an example for the believers through his speech and allow his life principles to be seen in how he lives his life, showing his faith. (v12)

In verse 14, Paul reminds Timothy of his calling, the gift he was given, and his commitment to leading the people to Christ.

Verse 15 shows Paul encouraging Timothy to remain focused and be 100% attentive to his work, some of which Paul highlighted so that everyone would see his commitment and progress.

In verses 16 and 17, he reminded Timothy that eyes would always be on him, so his life, expressions, and behavior must always be exemplary. And when he may feel challenged or dismayed, he needs to persevere and stay in the Spirit, as he is responsible for the present and future lives of his congregants and himself.

There is a message in the story for each of us. Sometimes, we are like Timothy, in need of encouragement. Other times, we are like Paul. We are responsible for encouraging one person responsible for shaping many lives.

This story keeps me in my sneakers, enthusiastically running my race, gradually bringing my commitment back to the forefront.

Once you are in the race, you are an encourager.

Shirley Chisholm and Kamala Harris Historic Runs for President

It was 1972 when Black Congresswoman Shirley Chisholm put her hat in the ring for the Democratic presidential bid.

This was a barrier-breaking event, but Shirley knew about breaking barriers as she broke many in her aspiring rise to becoming the first Black American woman to run for U.S. president.

Becoming a congresswoman in 1968 put her on the threshold of paving the path to the nation's highest office, which she hoped other Black women would follow.

In one of her addresses, Shirley said, "I am the candidate of the people of America, and my presence ushers in a new era in American political history."

As a newbie to the House of Representatives, Chisholm was assigned to a committee—the

one chosen for her despite her history growing up in the concrete jungle of New York: the House Agriculture Committee. "It seems that all they know here in Washington about Brooklyn is that a tree grew there," she so famously said that President Barack Obama even quoted it when he awarded her the Presidential Medal of Freedom posthumously in 2015.

As the first Black woman, Shirley Chisholm stepped up and took her shot at the presidency.



It's now 2024, 52 years later, and Vice President Kamala Harris has received the Democratic presidential vote and is the second Black American woman to run for the presidency.

A historical fact that must not be overlooked is Kamala is the sole candidate who has qualified to compete for the position of President.

First Black woman Attorney General of California.


U.S. Senator for California.

See you at the gathering.





A Review of the June 2024 CONNECT Newsletter

I was commissioned to write this review to provide written feedback on the contents of the June 2024 "CONNECT" Newsletter that was published by this church, Church of the Evangel Congregational, UCC. I gladly accepted to do it because of the great pleasure it had afforded me.

Holding the Newsletter in my hands, was like holding a good book! It was euphoric in nature! What pleasure I received from its earthy colors, clean lines, easy to read script that was well laid out and very organized. I felt a sense of urgency to turn the pages, curious to experience what was written within. I was not disappointed

It was a pleasure to see the picture of the men gathered together on the cover page. This is because they are in small numbers in our churches, and to witness the group, gave me a sense of hope for the future of the church. The first article, "Where Are You, Men? Rise!" confirmed this impression. It was full of tidbits of wisdom, encouragement, and direction for our men. There were several passages which resonated with me, and I hope with you too: On page 1, I was mesmerized by the concept, "We are the catalysts of change, starting from within and radiating outwards. Each of us has the power to shape a positive mindset. But we cannot inspire others if we are not

inspired."

Further in the article, on page 2, I was moved by words from these paragraphs: "2 Corinthians 4:7 describes us as 'fragile clay jars containing great treasure.' Indeed, I find that to be true. Our men are fragile creatures waiting to come alive.

Also on page 2, "When we move toward helping somebody, we will see how our pressure situations are reduced as we trust God and discover how much He can do in us and through us. We will see Him work in that person's life as we allow Him to work in our lives," is sound advice.

Page 3 elucidates thoughts of hope and importunity, "We must not be discouraged when our progress seems as slow as a moving turtle, but we must step out to step up." As leaders and optimists, we will see opportunity in every challenge and success in in every effort."

Page 3 continues, and this is my favorite passage from the article, "When we understand that we are where we are for a reason, we will gradually embrace the purpose and meaning of our lives."

And lastly, from page 3, "God has given each of us a position in life, and with each position, He has given us the power to do what He needs to be done." As you can see from the above discourse, this article, "Where Are You, Men? Rise!" impacted me greatly.

Brian's articles, "Anointed! Appointed! (page 4) and, "Passing the Baton," (page 5) were profoundly insightful. Every bit of these articles was food for the soul! Every word, every line, every paragraph were full of wisdom and guidance. If I were to highlight any passages from these two discourses, it would require my relaying the **entire** documents.

Look at the paragraph from "Anointed! Appointed!', in the middle of page 4: "...Patience will not be acquired in one place or season of our lives....So, we must embrace our tough times because they are preparation times when we are being anointed, leading up to being appointed." And from "Passing the Baton", "It happens to us throughout the day, every day; our Lord passes the baton to us through His wisdom so that we can run our race, the race He has prepared us to run...the race requires a team effort. It's a joint exercise....Our race is a 'relay' where we receive and pass on what our Lord placed in our hearts and hands. It's about purpose."

The last few pages (pages 8 – 12) were quite informative and endearing. "Ministry Corner" provided news updates. Honoring members of Evangel publicly, in the Newsletter, was a wonderful moment.

The "Thank You!" to Honorable Phyllis Fullerton, from all that I read, was most fitting. We thank God for her example, and for her legacy in passing the baton to others.

Recognizing Evangel's graduates must have brought tears and a sense of accomplishment and pride and appreciation to those who were so honored.

In Jesus' Name

We see God's promise in John 14:14: "Anything you ask of me, in my name, I will do it."

So, we close our prayer requests with the words, "In Jesus' name," and we hope God will answer and help us.

Let's delve into the significance of "In Jesus' name" in our prayer life. When we loosely attach the phrase "In Jesus' name" to our requests for help, we often don't feel connected, and not developing the connection implies we do not understand why it is essential. That relationship connection activates the flow of nourishment into our lives and fulfills our needs.

Understanding God's promise, "Anything you ask of me, in my name, I will do it," is not just a suggestion but a source of enlightenment and empowerment. It promotes the reward of peace and satisfaction, with underlying stability, and does not imply that our lives should be lived like the waves of the sea, yet we should expect timely answers to our prayers.

Our understanding of "In Jesus' name" is more than a formality but a catalyst. Those are words of belief that create a change for character development that can align us with God's

efforts through the Holy Spirit to uplift us. This truth can lead us to recognize how the power of prayer can transform our character, inspiring hope and a sense of purpose.

As we strengthen our prayer lives, moving away from the weak manner and lack of belief, we can expect to feel the Holy Spirit playing a crucial role in our spiritual journey, ready, willing, and able to shed light on our lack of understanding and leading our hearts to develop a connection with God. When we are connected, we can feel the Holy Spirit helping us in every area where we experience weakness.

We are now beginning to see our 'asking' and receiving as a two-way flow in the relationship pipeline interrupted only when we stop our input.

Our prayers must be bold and filled with hope, so a relationship with God is necessary to fortify us. This prepares us to pray, knowing that it's in Jesus' name that we do, and we expect our prayers to be answered.
