Village of Spencer Council Meeting of April 19, 2023

 At 6:30 p.m. a public hearing was held for legislation to change the village zoning ordinance for pools within the village.

Mayor DeRossett opened the meeting, there was no public input and Mayor DeRossett closed the meeting at 6:35 p.m. Council will move on with legislation to adopt during the council meeting.

Mayor DeRossett called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm, followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.

Minutes:

The minutes from the March 15, 2023 meeting were read individually. Mayor DeRossett pointed out that in the old news section, Susan Hirsch's pay should say that it would not exceed \$10,000.00. A motion to approve the amended minutes from the March 15, 2023 meeting made by Stangel, seconded by Kiousis, with all present council members voting "aye". Motion carried 5-0.

Treasurer's Report:

The treasurer's report was reviewed. A motion to approve the treasurer's report made by Stangel seconded by Walter, with all present council members voting "aye". Motion carried 5-0.

List of Bills:

The list of bills were reviewed. A motion to approve the list of bills made by Walter, seconded by Stangel, with all present council members voting "aye". Motion carried 5-0.

Gov't agencies etc: Nothing to report

Mayor's report: Dan DeRossett:

- Mayor reported that he had met with two different electricians for the legion building, but had no estimates as of the meeting.
- Mayor had a list of appraisers and was in the process of working on getting the legion building appraised as well as Grid Iron Guys to look at the roof.
- Mayor contacted the state forester for our area and informed council that the man was working in Seville at
 this time and has not heard anything back from him as of the meeting.
- Gauchat met with the land conservancy person at the Leck property. He said that there were ATV tracks again leading to a house on Millstone Lane.
 - o Huber said it was time to put up signs and have the police enforce the issue.

Solicitor's report: Greg Huber:

• Huber reported that he drafted legislation for the zoning change and had started to work on the firearms legislation but hasn't finished yet.

Finance: Tom Gehring:

• Tom was not present. Ramey and Walter explained that the committee discussed and recommend a \$1.00 per hour increase for part time employees, excluding police since they have their own schedule, for every five years of service with the village. Council agreed and Greg will draft an amended salary ordinance for next month.

Streets, Sidewalks & Sanitation: Jeff Gauchat: ...

• Stangel said he reached out to Cunningham and Associates about grants for Jefferson, Washington and Stuart Streets. Next meeting scheduled May 11, 2023 at 7:00 p.m.

Legislative and Planning: Chris Krystofek:

- Krystofek reported that they discussed the pool ordinance and the contract with Susan Hirsch for the zoning book updates.

Parks/Buildings & Lighting: Jim Stangel:

- Stangel discussed the replacement of the old Firestone sign with the legend of the park on it from Medina Signs. They still have not ordered it yet because it needed to be gone over more. Gauchat and Stangel discussed the person Gauchat knew as well to do the work. They will continue to work on it.
- Walter reported that she had spoken with Hot Stove and they have invested \$24,000.00 in repairs of the fields and were asking if the village would fix the dugout on field #4. It would cost roughly \$4,200.00. Walter did not have an estimate for the work to be done. Gauchat will get with them to get a clearer idea of what they are wanting from the village and report back.

Safety/ Parking, Vehicle & Health: Jim Kiousis:

- Kiousis discussed a new officer that will be only working special events and holidays, and gave his background in law enforcement.
- Kiousis reported that the committee approved the purchase of anew outer vest for the department.

- Huber discussed the police cruiser and stated that since it was over the \$50,000.00 benchmark it would have to be put out for bid.
