

ORDINANCE NO. 195

AN EMERGENCY ORDINANCE OF THE VILLAGE OF SPENCER, OHIO
AUTHORIZING THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF PUBLIC AFFAIRS TO
ENTER INTO CONTRACT, WITHOUT ADVERTISING AND COMPETITIVE
BIDDING, FOR THE PURCHASE OF LIME FEEDER FOR USE AT THE
MUNICIPALLY OWNED WATER TREATMENT PLANT

Whereas, the Spencer Village Board of Trustees of Public Affairs has reported to this Council the immediate necessity of purchasing a replacement lime feeder, with scales or other appropriate measuring device for use at the municipal water treatment plant,

And, Whereas, this Council deems it necessary to purchase such equipment immediately without advertisement and competitive bidding pursuant to the exceptions granted by the terms of Ohio Revised Code Section 735.051,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF SPENCER, MEDINA COUNTY, OHIO, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1: The Village Board of Trustees of Public Affairs is hereby authorized to enter into contract immediately for the purchase of one (1) B.I.F. Lime Feeder, with scales or other proper approved measuring device, for use at the municipal water treatment plant for PH control and for water softening purposes.

SECTION 2: Said Board is further authorized to contract for such additional services as may be necessary and essential in removing the old worn out feeder and installing the new equipment.

SECTION 3: The funds required for the purposes set forth above are now in the village treasury, are not appropriated for any other purpose and are specifically appropriated by this council for the purposes set forth herein.

SECTION 4: The action authorized hereunder is considered by this Council as one of those clear and present emergency situations referred to in Ohio R. C. Sec. 735.051 not requiring advertisement and competitive bidding, it being a situation arising in connection with repair of the municipally owned water treatment plant.

SECTION 5: This ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, safety and welfare in said Village and for the further reason that it relates to immediate repair and/or replacement of a vital portion of the water treatment plant and, provided it receive the requisite vote for passage as an emergency measure, shall go into immediate operation and effect, otherwise it shall become effective at the earliest period allowed by law.
