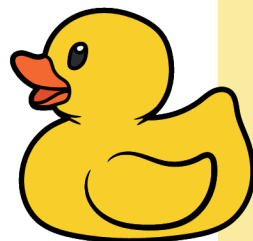
At Meeting House Preschool, our classes for students ages 2-5 are filled with discovery, imagination, and creative exploration. Our caring teachers understand that children learn best through play!

This Little Duck Ignites Imagination

When your child plays, they're developing creativity, curiosity, and confidence. Here are some fun ways to spark creative play- you might be surprised by the exciting adventures your child takes with their duck!

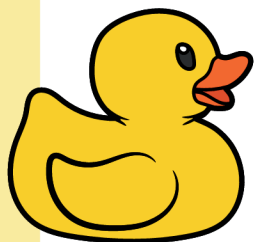
Indoor Imagination

Build a "Duck Home" out of blocks or recycled boxes. Set up a "Duck Hospital", complete with bandages, kind words, and gentle care. Host a "Duck Parade" through the house; line up stuffed animals as spectators! Create a "Duck Theater"; pass out tickets and sing a song or dance.



Outdoor Exploration

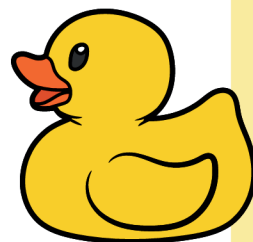
Take your duck outside to explore; point out pretty leaves and rocks. Build a nest from leaves, float your duck in a puddle, or draw a chalk "pond". Bring your duck along on a neighborhood walk and encourage your child to make up a story as you go; every familiar sight now becomes a new adventure!



Music and Movement

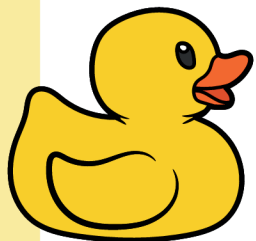
Do a Duck Dance! Put on some music and pretend the duck is waddling, flapping their wings, or swimming. Your child can follow along with movements to the music.

Add silly sounds like duck quacks as part of the fun!
Try slow-motion waddles and fast splashes!



Visit the Library and Read "10 Little Rubber Ducks" by Eric Carle

Share this exciting book with your child and then let your duck go on its own journey! Think of what adventures your duck might have if it were traveling aboard a ship...or plane...or car! Ask questions like: "Where will our duck travel next?" "Who might it meet?" This kind of imaginative storytelling supports early literacy, empathy, and language development, all while keeping play at the heart of learning.
