## Frequently Asked Questions...

What forms of payment are accepted? We accept cash and checks. You can also pay class fees and clear for athletics and activities on-line at https://wa-evergreen.intouchreceipting.com/

What is an ASB sticker for? Proceeds from the stickers are used to support and promote all student activities at Shahala: athletics, after school clubs, and social events. Only students who purchase an ASB sticker are eligible to participate in school sports teams and intramurals.

**Do the uniforms shrink and what sizes are available?** The t-shirts are preshrunk cotton and not much, if any, shrinking should occur. The shorts are made of nylon and will not shrink. PE uniforms are adult sizes. Available sizes: Extra Small, Small, Medium, Large, XL and 2XL.

**How an I pay for my student's lunch account?** Your student's lunch account can be paid at the cafeteria cash register, ASB office or on-line. Please make lunch account checks payable to E.S.D.

**Do I have to buy a yearbook right now?** No. Although it is highly recommended that the yearbook is purchased at the beginning of the year, they can be purchased through the end of March in order to ensure that your student will get one.

When are yearbooks distributed? Yearbooks are generally distributed the last week of school.



## **Student Schedules**

- Student schedules for 7th and 8th graders will be distributed on the first day of school. Posters will be placed around the school that list student names and their first period teacher. Students will report to first period where schedules will be distributed.
- 6th grade students who missed orientation can pick up their schedules in the front office before the first day of school or can locate their name on the 6th grade scheduling posters and report to first period.
- Please note that schedules that are displayed in Skyward are not official. The paper copies
  distributed to students during Day One are the most recent versions. Schedule changes, at times,
  occur up to the night before school.

# Attendance/Absences: Call (360) 604-3805

If your student is going to be absent or tardy, please call the attendance line and leave a message. A written excuse, phone call or personal contact with the school by the parent or guardian is required for all absences.

You have three days to excuse an absence. You can call the Attendance Office directly 24 hours a day. We also ask that absences of four days or more, for reasons other than illness, be prearranged. Five or more sick day require a doctor's note to be excused.

#### **Student Phone Use**

The student phone in the front office is for emergency use only.


#### **Permission for Bus Rides with Friends**

Arrangements to ride the bus home with a friend must be made at home. Students need to bring a note, signed by a parent or guardian, to the front office before school to be approved and used as a bus pass.

Watch the district website for announcements when the 2017-18 Free & Reduced applications are available. Apply early to avoid potentially unnecessary meal charges when school begins.

Hard copies will be distributed to the schools for availability when offices open and will be available at district office.

Families of students entering 6th grade should be aware that there is a \$0.30 increase in lunch price and \$0.20 increase in breakfast price from elementary to middle school. They should also be aware that there are à la cart items (drinks, chips, cookies, etc.) available for purchase during lunch time that are additional costs. Parents/guardians will want to address their purchase expectations with their children and make payments to their food service accounts appropriately.



## A Note From Your School Nurse

#### **Medications**

In rare emergency/disaster situations, children may need to be kept at school beyond the regular school day. If your child has a chronic health condition and needs to take medication on a regular basis, especially before and/or after school, we encourage you to talk with your child's health care provider to determine if a supply of emergency medicine needs to be kept at school. If so, we must have a Medication at School form completed by the health care provider and signed by the parent. This medication must be provided in the properly labeled original container.

Evergreen Public Schools is authorized by RCW 28A.210.260 and 270 to administer oral medication to students during school hours. It is state policy to administer such medication only when necessary to permit students to attend school. We define medication to mean all drugs, whether prescription or over-the-counter. Medications such as ointments, eye, nose, or ear drops, suppositories, injections other than emergency, and medications inhaled through the nose are not considered oral medications. If your student requires anything other than oral medications, please consult with your school nurse.

To request the school to administer medication, the health care provider must complete and sign an Authorization for Administration of Medication at School form. Parent or guardian signature is also required. Requests for the administration of medication are valid only for the medications listed and the dates indicated in writing on the request form. Requests are valid for a maximum of one year, but never past the end of the current school year. Medication must be transported by parent or guardian and supplied to the school in the properly labeled original container(s). The instructions on the prescription bottle must match those on the authorization form. It is against district policy and drug free schools for a student to transport medication to and from school. School personnel will not be responsible for reminding students to take medication during school hours.

Students in grades six through twelve may carry and self-administer medication at school (except for those considered to be controlled substances under federal law) with a completed Authorization for Administration of Medication at School form on file and permission from the health care provider and parent.

#### Does Your Child Have a Health Condition?

If your child has a serious health condition such as diabetes, seizure disorder, asthma, or a severe allergy to a bee sting or a particular food, it is important to notify the office. If you believe bus drivers should know about this condition while transporting your child to and from school, please contact the district's transportation department at (360) 604-4950 to communicate your child's special needs.

## It is imperative that we be able to reach a parent during school hours.

We need current home, work and at least two local emergency telephone numbers. Please update the school office whenever there are telephone number and/or address changes.

# **Greetings from the Band Department**

Here are some suggestions for keeping your band skills sharp this summer!

- Go to a music store and buy a book of fun music to play.
- Go to a concert and get inspired!
- Get together with a friend who plays an instrument and play together.

All band students will need to have their instruments on the second day of school.

**Sixth grade Concert Band** students (those who have completed one year of elementary band) need to bring your band books from last year and your instruments.

**Sixth grade Beginning Band** students: We prefer that you not make an instrument choice until we have met with you the first week of school and then we will make the decision together. You will need to rent an instrument and purchase a band book (about \$7) when an instrument has been agreed upon. (There are a limited number of school-owned instruments available. See instructor.)

After the first day of school, parents should be expecting a calendar of events and a class grading policy that you will sign and return to us.

Please get your supplies before school starts. Each clarinet or saxophone player needs a box of 10 reeds in at least a #2 ½ strength. 8th graders need #3 strength. Brass players need valve oil and tuning slide grease.

Summer is a great time to get your instrument into the shop for a tune up! Have a great summer!

The ASB office will open for sports clearing on Monday, August 13th at 8:00 am. Clearance forms can be picked up at the ASB office or found on Shahala's website.

# Girls' Cross Country Begins August 20th


This is the 10th year of Girls Cross Country at Shahala for 6th, 7th, and 8th grade girls. Cross Country running consists of races over different terrain (grass, gravel, bark dust, etc.) in which runners will be competing at a distance of 1.5 miles. We had 110 girls turn out for the team last year and we are hoping to have at least that many girls out this year.

No athletes will be cut from the team, thus all participants who turn out will be able to compete. Cross Country is the only fall sport in which 6th grade girls can compete at Shahala. Cross Country is a fun sport to participate in, but also serves as a great place to build fitness, strength, and endurance for other sports such as soccer, basketball, or volleyball.

The team will be coached by Mr. Kotsovos, Mr. McCarthy and Mrs. Swink. All coaches have a great deal of experience coaching Cross Country distance runners. They are looking forward to the upcoming season with the new team members and those who participated last year.

No experience is needed to participate in Cross Country. Practices will consist of many active relay games, scavenger hunts, longer slow runs, and short intervals to help build endurance and strength. Athletes will learn about Cross Country competitions from an individual and team perspective, and about running in general.

Practices begin on August 20th and are every weekday once the season starts. The season ends in early October. Athletes must have their clearance completed before beginning practice. In preparation for the season, athletes should do some light running 3 to 4 days a week, between 10 and 30 minutes a day.
