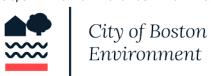

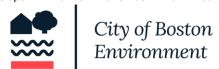

Additional Information

A. General Information

6. General Project Description:

The proposed project is located at The Barking Crab in the Seaport district, within Boston's Inner Harbor on the east bank of the Fort Point Channel. This site is managed by Poseidon Enterprises, Inc. and is a pier that supports a restaurant and provides access to the adjacent marina. The project involves routine maintenance including replacement of deteriorated sections of the existing fender system along the pier face, as well as repairs to structural timber piles and timber pile caps. Construction is anticipated to begin in the winter of 2025 and is expected to take approximately 3 to 6 months to complete, depending on site conditions and weather.

The existing fender system is composed of timber piles driven outshore of the pier and bolted into the existing pier. Six of these piles have advanced deterioration due to marine borer damage. This has resulted in significant section loss with one pile that is wild and could pose a navigational hazard in the future as it continues to worsen.

The pier is constructed of all timber including piles, pile caps, bracing, stringers, and decking. Many piles and some of the pile caps have experienced significant damage due to dry rot, marine borer damage, and fungal decay in addition to areas where previous repairs were insufficient. The damaged components will be removed and replaced with new timber elements of similar size, material, and configuration to maintain the functional integrity of the pier.

A total of six 12 diameter timber fender piles will be replaced in kind. (36) 12 inch diameter timber support piles will be posted by cutting out the bad area of timber, replacing it, then encapsulating the pile in concrete. The pile caps with extensive deterioration will be repaired by sistering members on the sides. In addition, there are several non-bearing piles that will be repaired with shims.

This project supports the long-term preservation and usability of the Barking Crab's waterfront infrastructure, ensuring that it remains a safe, functional, and accessible facility within Boston's harbor system.

Statement on Climate Resiliency

The repairs on the Barking Crab involve routine maintenance. The function will not be altered, and the footprint will remain unchanged. These repairs will not negatively affect the area around The Barking Crab restaurant. These repairs will not change the ability to manage stormwater, runoff, or flooding of the pier. The engineering team has utilized all available best management practices

to ensure that the project meets the projected life cycle and will not unnecessarily change or impede navigation to the surrounding area or impacts to the resource areas.

This project is being completed to address deterioration of the structural members of the pier prior to them causing any restrictions on the use of the facility. This project and all work being completed along with it will not impede future efforts to increase the elevation of the structure to address sea level rise.

B. Buffer Zone and Resource Area Impacts (Temporary & Permanent)

3. Coastal Resource Areas:

2.0 Land Under the Ocean

Land under the ocean is defined in 310 CMR 10.25(2) as "land extending from the mean low water line seaward to the boundary of the municipality's jurisdiction and includes land under estuaries". The Nearshore Area is defined as "land under the ocean means that land extending from the mean low water line to the seaward limit of a municipality's jurisdiction, but in no case beyond the point where the land is 80 feet below the level of the ocean at mean low water".

2.1 Performance Standards

"When land under the ocean or nearshore areas of land under the ocean are found to be significant to the protection of marine Fisheries, protection of wildlife habitat, storm damage prevention or flood control, 310 CMR 10.25(3) through (7) shall apply".

- 3) Improvement dredging for navigational purposes affecting land under the ocean shall be designed and carried out using the best available measures so as to minimize adverse effects on such interests caused by changes in:
 - (a) bottom topography which will result in increased flooding or erosion caused by an increase in the height or velocity of waves impacting the shore;
 - (b) sediment transport processes which will increase flood or erosion hazards by affecting the natural replenishment of beaches;
 - (c) water circulation which will result in an adverse change in flushing rate, temperature, or turbidity levels; or
 - (d) marine productivity which will result from the suspension or transport of pollutants, the smothering of bottom organisms, the accumulation of pollutants by organisms, or the destruction of marine fisheries habitat or wildlife habitat.

These regulations do not apply as the project does not include maintenance dredging.

4) Maintenance dredging for navigational purposes affecting land under the ocean shall be designed and carried out using the best available measures so as to minimize adverse effects on such interests caused by changes in marine productivity which will result from the suspension or transport of pollutants, increases in turbidity, the smothering of bottom organisms, the accumulation of pollutants by organisms, or the destruction of marine fisheries habitat or wildlife habitat.

These regulations do not apply as the project does not include maintenance dredging for navigational purposes.

5) Projects not included in 310 CMR 10.25(3) or (4) which affect nearshore areas of land under the ocean shall not cause adverse effects by altering the bottom topography so as to increase storm damage or erosion of coastal beaches, coastal banks, coastal dunes, or salt marshes.

The work being done to land under the ocean involves removing and replacing fender piles, which will take up the same net area which currently exists. In addition, 30 piles will be repaired by installing concrete encasements over the post repairs. The concrete encasements will be approximately 30 inch diameter. These are sized as small as possible to minimize impact on the land under ocean. In total this will result in approximately 50 square feet of concrete on the mudline. Similar repairs have been made to this pier over the past 15 years. The repairs will be less invasive than they would be to replace the piles in kind and will have no impact on the storm damage or erosion.

- 6) Projects not included in 310 CMR 10.25(3) which affect land under the ocean shall if water-dependent be designed and constructed, using best available measures, so as to minimize adverse effects, and if non-water-dependent, have no adverse effects, on marine fisheries habitat or wildlife habitat caused by:
 - (a) alterations in water circulation;

The project will not alter the water circulation of Boston Harbor. The footprint is minimal.

(b) destruction of eelgrass (Zostera marina) or widgeon grass (Rupia maritina) beds;

This does not apply because there is no eelgrass in the area of the project.

(c) alterations in the distribution of sediment grain size;

This does not apply because the project will not add any or alter the distribution of sediment grain size. The bottom will remain larger untouched except within the footprint and that area is minimal.

(d) changes in water quality, including, but not limited to, other than natural fluctuations in the level of dissolved oxygen, temperature or turbidity, or the addition of pollutants; or

The project will not affect the water quality in any way. The contractor will use all best construction practices to avoid impacts including usage of a sediment boom during all work.

(e) alterations of shallow submerged lands with high densities of polychaetes, mollusks or macrophytic algae.

The project location does not have high densities of polychaetes, mollusks, or macrophytic algae.

7) Notwithstanding the provisions of 310 CMR 10.25(3) through (6), no project may be permitted which will have any adverse effect on specified habitat sites of rare vertebrate or invertebrate species, as identified by procedures established under 310 CMR 10.37.

The project does not have any adverse effects on specified habitat sites of rare vertebrate or invertebrate species. There are no species listed in this area. See the attached map.

Mitigation Measures

All construction activities will adhere to strict debris and turbidity control measures. Contractors will use best practices including the usage of a sediment containment boom.

Upon project completion, all construction materials, equipment, and temporary staging platforms will be removed from the site, and no long-term disruption to the resource area is anticipated. Given the limited scope, short duration, and in-kind nature of the work, the proposed project is expected to result in minimal impacts to Land Under the Ocean.

4.0 Land Subject to Coastal Storm Flowage-

Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) Flood Insurance Rate Maps (FIRM) for the city of Boston FEMA Community Panel Map Number 25025C0081K was reviewed. As per review of the FIRM map, the project is located between Zone AE (EL. 10.0 in reference to NAVD88) and Zone X (low risk flood area).

Land Subject to Coastal Storm Flowage (LSCSF) is defined in 310 CMR 10.04 as the "land subject to any inundation caused by coastal storms up to and including that caused by the 100-year storm, surge of record or storm of record, whichever is greater". The project falls mostly in Zone X, meaning there is low risk of coastal flooding. Approximately 1% of the property falls into the AE Zone, meaning the elevation of water will be, as noted on the FEMA map, EL. 10.0 in reference to NAVD88. The entire wharf falls below this elevation

(approximate elevation +9.4 feet). The project does not alter or affect, in any way, the ability to control coastal flooding or impede its ability to prevent coastal storm damage.

This project is outside of the seawall and with no significant changes and therefore does not fall into this category.

Other Applicable Standards and Requirements

7. Is this project subject to provisions of the MADEP Stormwater Management Standards?:

This project is not subject to the provisions of the MassDEP Stormwater Management Standards, as outlined in 310 CMR 10.05(6)(k). The proposed work involves the in-kind replacement of existing timber fender piles, support piles, and pile caps at the Barking Crab and will be conducted entirely over tidal waters. No new impervious surfaces will be created, and there will be no land disturbance or alteration of any upland or wetland resource areas. Additionally, the project does not generate or discharge stormwater and, therefore, does not trigger applicability under the Stormwater Management Standards.

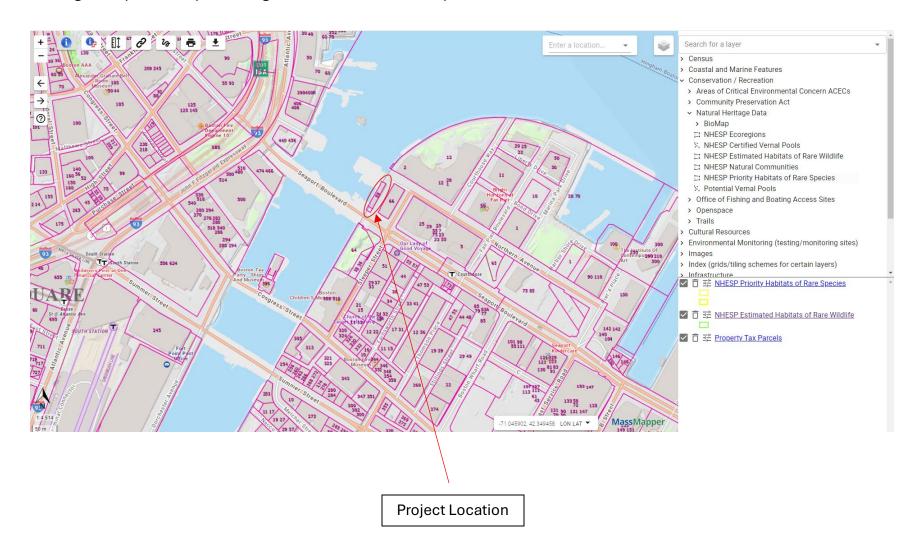
Dry rotted timber pile cap.

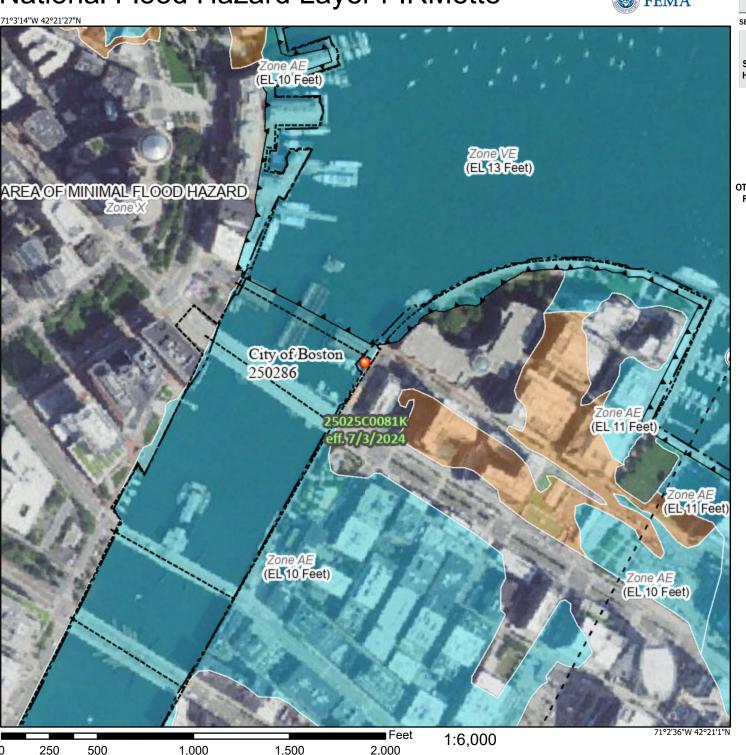

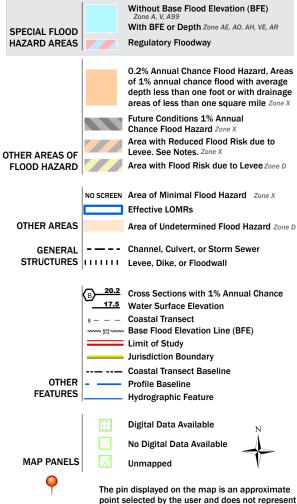
National Flood Hazard Layer FIRMette

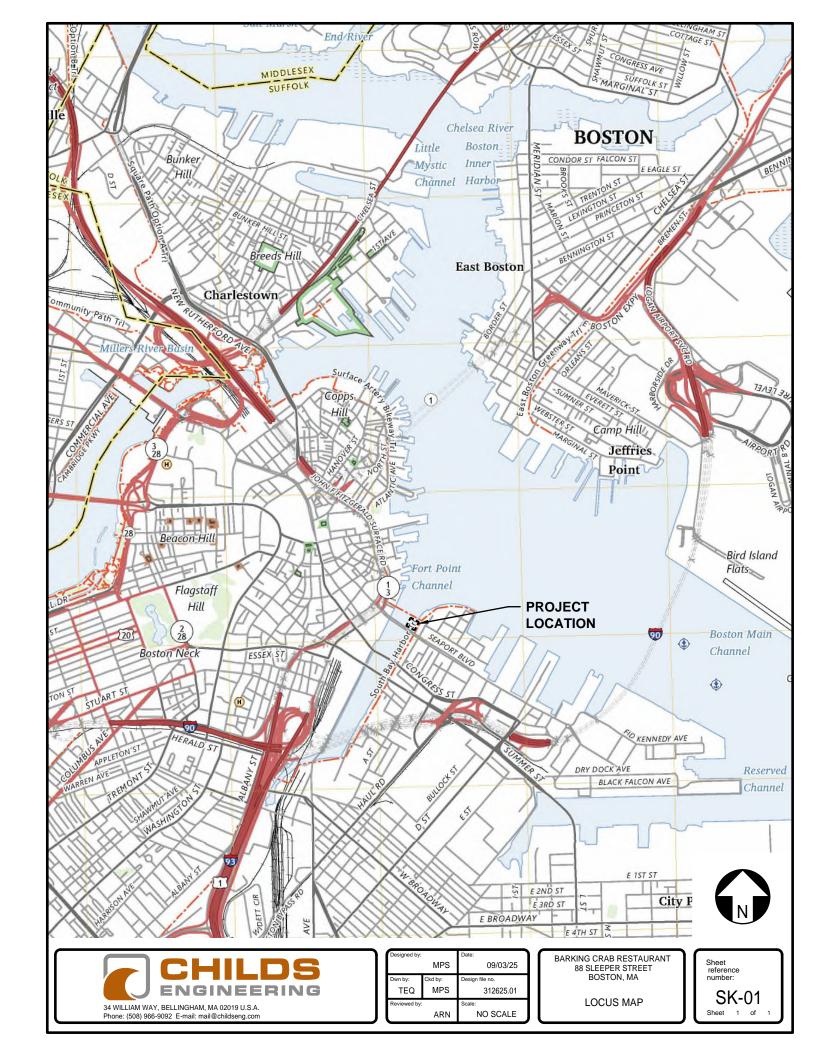

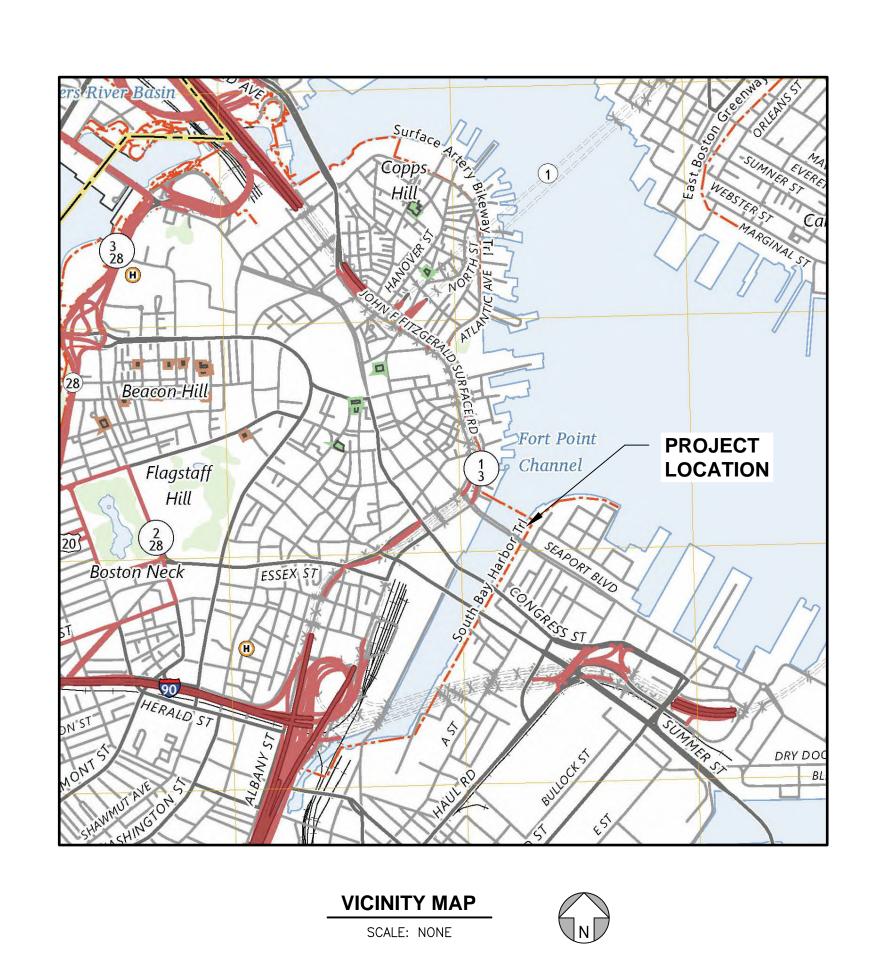

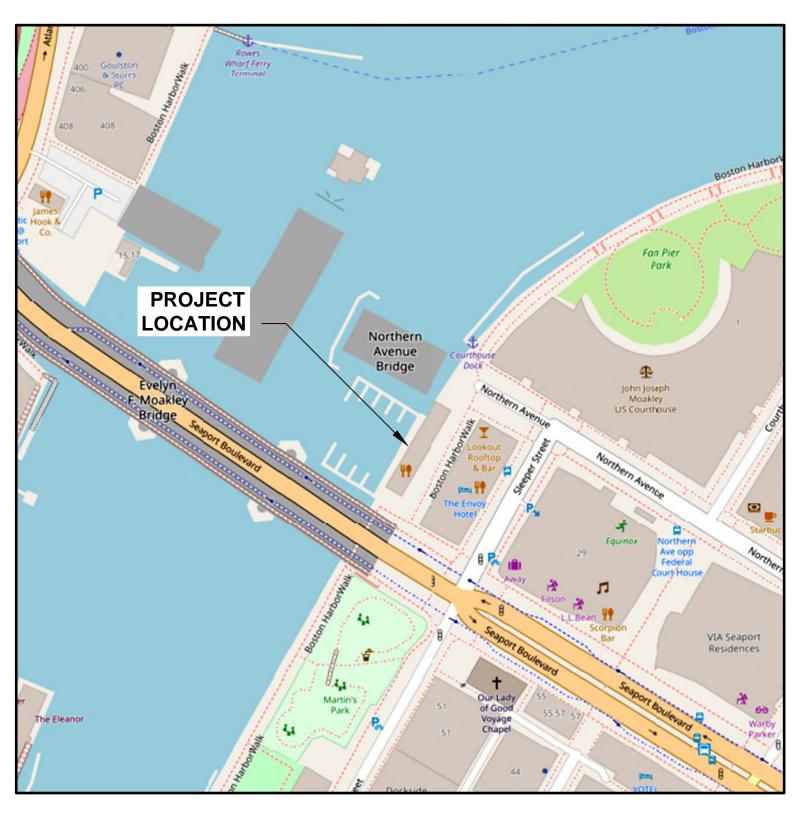

BELOW DECK REPAIRS BARKING CRAB RESTAURANT 88 SLEEPER STREET BOSTON, MA





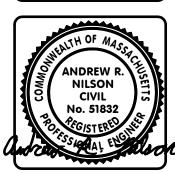


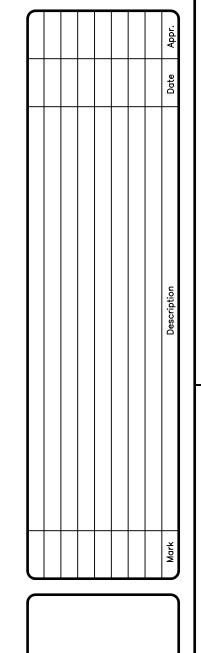
