Although linked with <u>The Congressional Black Caucus (CBC)</u>, <u>The Congressional Black Caucus Foundation</u>, <u>Inc. (CBCF)</u> is a <u>separate</u> nonprofit group that runs programs in education, healthcare and economic development. Established in 1976 by members of the CBC, the CBCF began as a non-partisan research institute on issues affecting African Americans. Today the CBCF continues that research, publishes a yearly report on key legislation, and sponsors issue forums, leadership seminars, conferences and scholarships with an office located in Washington, D.C.

A. Shuanise Washington is president and chief executive officer and Congresswoman Sheila Jackson Lee (TX) is the current chairwoman of the board. Fundraising events and corporate partners support CBCF programs. The CBCF funds many of its activities by hosting the Annual Legislative Conference and Phoenix Awards Dinner each September. The CBCF often works with the Congressional Black Caucus Spouses, a group of wives and husbands of the African American members of the United States Congress.

Rep. Sheila Jackson Lee 47th CBCF ALC Phoenix Awards Dinner

Congresswoman Sheila Jackson Lee (TX) serves as CBCF Board Chair. When she could not get to her own home during Hurricane Harvey, instead of going to a cozy hoity-toity resort, Rep. Jackson Lee went straight to a shelter and worked side-by-side with volunteers and first responders with her "All Hands on Deck" spirit. At the same time, she was campaigning on Capitol Hill for her fellow Houstonians. Rep. Jackson Lee introduced, "The Hurricane Harvey Small Business Recovery Grants Act" (H.R.3930), which, if passed, will establish the Office of Hurricane Harvey Small Business Recovery Grants in the Small Business Administration to assist certain small businesses affected by Hurricane Harvey. Rep. Jackson Lee has not missed an opportunity to speak up for her Beloved constituents and rebuilding Houston, Texas. Amidst all of this turmoil, like a trooper, Rep. Jackson Lee led the 47th CBCF ALC with vim and vigor. She said, "The culminating Phoenix Awards Dinner is a special occasion that honors diligent leaders in our community and encourages other leaders to do the work necessary for the betterment of Black lives around the globe. As we find ourselves in unparalleled times, it is critical that we come together and uplift each other through celebration and collaboration at the ALC—the Phoenix Awards Dinner aims to do just that."

This is just the tip of the iceberg for Rep. Jackson Lee's work. She is sponsoring over 50 bills that can significantly help her constituents in Texas as well as other communities in America and around the world. Her sponsored bills include the Save America Comprehensive Immigration Act of 2017 (H.R.3647); SIMARRA Act (H.R.3410); Justice for Children Now Act of 2017 (H.R.1985); Triple-Negative Breast Cancer Research and Education Act of 2017 (H.R.1984); USA Values Act of 2017 (H.R.735); and Fair Chance for Youth Act of 2017 (H.R.61).

Her insight and commitment to improving our human condition is a beacon for other lawmakers to follow. Here are just a few of her initiatives to save the planet, one community at a time: Today's American Dream Act (H.R.3839); Helping to Encourage Real Opportunities (HERO) for At-Risk Youth Act (H.R.2209); Community College to Career Fund Act (H.R.2207); and Supporting the goals and ideals of "National Gun Violence Awareness Day" and "National Gun Violence Awareness Month" (H.R.361).

Rep. Marc A. Veasey (TX). hands were also full aiding his Dallas / Fort Worth constituents in the aftermath of Hurricanes Harvey and Irma, and pushing for Supplemental Appropriations for Hurricane Harvey Disaster Relief; which also PASSED in the **House.** The disaster aid package will provide \$7.85 billion to aid in Hurricane Harvey relief, including \$7.4 billion for FEMA and \$450 million for the Small Business Administration (SBA). Rep. Veasey has introduced almost 60 bills, addressing all of the SDGs, including the Methane Emissions Mitigation Act (H.R.2830); Diversity in Military Leadership Act (H.R.5704); Reduce Barriers to College Act Protection Act of 2016 Police (H.R.3516); (H.R.6217); Partnerships for the Future Act of 2016 (H.R.6064); as well as several bills for veteran's and immigration rights.



Ryan has authored two best-seller books, <u>"The Presidency in Black and White: My Up-Close View of Three Presidents and Race in America"</u> and <u>"At Mama's Knee: Mothers and Race in Black and White."</u> Ryan has a more personal approach to her philanthropy. In honor of her mother, Vivian G. Ryan, Morgan State University has set up a scholarship in her name, **The Vivian G. Ryan Scholarship**, to which Ryan is a major benefactor. Ryan is following in her mother's footsteps by being a positive role model, and empowering African American youth to be productive and stand up for their rights.

Humanitarian, multi-Grammy award-winning singer, television show host, and Ambassador Dionne Warwick entertained the audience during dinner (a nice surprise because she was not on the program). Warwick is the second most-charted female vocalist of all time, with 56 singles making the Billboard Hot 100. She has a career spanning more than 40 years with a musical catalog including gospel, rock and roll and R&B. During the Phoenix Awards Dinner, she sang a medley of her songs, including my favorite, "That's What Friends Are For" that was recorded with **Gladys** Knight, Elton John and Stevie the American Foundation for AIDS Research (AmFAR). Warwick is a supporter of The Hunger Project and serves as Global Goodwill Ambassador for the United Nations Food and Agriculture Organization.

Dr. Clarence E. Knight is a professional musician experienced in musical theater, recordings, and performances whose career spans five decades. He has worked with many luminaries including Pearl Bailey, Ray Charles, George Duke, Aretha Franklin, Lena Horne, Freddie Jackson, Gladys Knight, Johnny Mathis, The Four Tops, The Jackson Five, The Temptations, Stevie Wonder (just to name a few). He is CEO of Clarence E. Knight Productions and the leader of Clarence Knight Orchestra. His orchestra is in high demand all across the United States and has been the band of choice for the Congressional Black Caucus Awards Dinner (over 10 years), Presidential Inaugurati

ons' (5), and many other political, corporate, and VIP events. His Company also provides back-up musicians for hundreds of shows and artists around the world. Knight is a former Chair and Professor of Music, Department of Fine and Performing Arts, Bowie State University. He holds the Bachelor of Music Education and Masters of Music Education degrees from Howard University and the Ed. D. in Educational Administration Degree from The George Washington University.

Talent: Jackson opened the 47th CBCF ALC Phoenix Awards Dinner with her sultry soprano voice singing, "The Star Spangled Banner" and "Lift Every Voice and Sing." Jackson has a new Christmas CD, Cierra Jackson: "It Was The Night", which is spellbinding. Beauty: Jackson is a genuine Beauty Queen. She has won or placed in many pageants including Miss Phi Beta Sigma of the Chi Chapter at Morehouse College (2010-2011), Miss Brookhaven, GA (2011), Miss Rome, GA (2013), Miss Columbus, GA (2015), Miss District of Columbia (2016), and Miss America (2017). his profound influence on our nation as a legendary educator and prolific scholar, and for his long-standing commitment to improving the quality of life for black students that will leave a significant and lasting impression for generations to come. Dr. Freeman founded the <code>Texas Southern University Debate Team</code> and earned the moniker, "The <code>Great Debater</code>," for his immaculate genius. After 68 years, Dr. Freeman can still be found in his office as Head Coach Emeritus, and continues to help students find their voice.

Ruby Bridges received the CBC Chair Phoenix Award for her fearless leadership and willingness to confront segregation head on in the New Orleans school system. Her achievements include leading the way for integrating America's schools, being one of the youngest members of the civil rights movement, and showing courage during the struggle for integration are legendary. In 1960, when she was only six years old, her parents responded to a request from the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP) and volunteered her to participate in the integration of the New Orleans school system. By taking that first step into an all-white school at such a young age, Bridges made a lasting impact on American society. From that day to the present, Hall has diligently fought against racism and prays that one day it will be a subject only spoken about in history textbooks.

Ambassador Ronald Kirk received the ALC Co-Chair's Phoenix Award for his outstanding contributions to the enhancement of improved relations in foreign affairs and for his belief that trade is the strongest key to unlocking jobs and growth for the American economy and global prosperity. Ambassador Kirk was the first African-American to serve as U.S. trade representative and was a member of President Barack Obama's cabinet, serving as the president's principal trade adviser, negotiator, and spokesperson on trade issues. Ambassador Kirk has held several other most prestigious positions: Secretary of State of Texas; Mayor of Dallas; Lobbyist for Vinson & Elkins, Energy Future Holdings, and Merrill Lynch; and currently Senior Counsel at Gibson, Dunn & Crutcher's Dallas and Washington D.C. offices where he is co-chair of both the International Trade and Sports Law practices. He is also a member of the Public Policy, Crisis Management, and Private Equity practice groups.


Tamika D. Mallory will receive the ALC Co-Chair's Phoenix Award in recognition of her exemplary leadership and commitment to social justice and civil rights advocacy, equal rights for women, health care, gun violence and police misconduct. Mallory is a highly sought after speaker, who travels worldwide to address issues plaguing our society and solutions to bring forth change. As president of Mallory Consulting, a strategic planning and event management firm, Mallory has worked with Fortune 500 corporations, non-profit organizations and international NGOs. She is a board member of The Gathering for Justice, active member of Justice League NYC, co-chair for The Women's March, and served as a member of the Transition Committee for NYC Mayor-Elect Bill de Blasio. In her previous position as Executive Director of the National Action Network (Rev. Al Sharpton's civil rights organization), Mallory was instrumental in creating New York City's Crisis Management System, an official gun violence prevention program that awards nearly \$27 million to violence prevention organizations annually. Her great humanitarian work, has earned Mallory a place on the 2017 Time 100 Pioneers List as well as Fortune's 2017 List of The World's Greatest Leaders.

The Honorable Bennie G. Thompson received the Harold Washington Phoenix Award in recognition of his immeasurable contributions to African American political awareness, empowerment and advancement of minorities in the electoral process. Congressman Thompson has spent his entire life giving a voice to the voiceless. His lifelong public service record is a testament to his unwavering dedication to the constituents of the 2nd Congressional District of Mississippi. Congressman Thompson is sponsoring over 175 bills and co-sponsoring 3,470 supporting Agriculture Appropriations, Civil Rights, Economic Recovery, Education, Emergency Services, Energy and Environment, Health Care and Health Care Reform, Homeland Security and Anti-Terrorism, Jobs and the Economy, Social Security, and Veterans. He is the longest-serving African American elected official in the state of Mississippi.
