- 5. Spiritual Growth / Interpersonal Skills: Encouraging children to explore their own spirituality and develop a sense of inner peace and purpose through our Catholic Faith. For many, religious education nurtures spiritual development, helping children explore their beliefs and find meaning and purpose in life. This can contribute to their overall well-being and mental health. Engaging with religious education can improve children's empathy, compassion, and interpersonal skills as they learn to engage respectfully with people of different beliefs and backgrounds. Learning about their own religious traditions can help children develop a sense of identity and belonging. It can also connect them to a larger community that shares their beliefs and values.
- 6. Respect and Tolerance / Social Cohesion: Promoting respect for people, beliefs and fostering an environment of tolerance and acceptance in our beliefs and deeds in serve to our Lord. Unders standing and respecting different religions can reduce prejudice and conflict, promoting social cohesion and peaceful coexistence.
