
HISTORY OF THE COLLEGE OF PHYSICIANS OF MALAYSIA

Foundation and Early Development (1972-1993)

The College of Physicians of Malaysia was established in 1972 with the formation of a Pro-Tem Committee, led by Tan Sri Datuk Dr. R. P. Pillay as President and Dato' Dr. Amir Abbas as Secretary. The primary objectives of the college were to advance the study and practice of medicine, promote clinical research, and foster collaboration among physicians. A key focus was on supporting local medical education and facilitating scientific discussions and demonstrations to enhance medical knowledge.

In 1973, the college received temporary registration from the Registrar of Societies (ROS). Collaborative discussions with the College of General Practitioners and the College of Surgeons were held to address shared concerns within the medical community. These efforts culminated in a joint meeting with the Malaysian Minister of Health in 1978, where challenges such as the high cost of overseas training and the limited availability of local postgraduate medical education were discussed. Although the college advocated for parliamentary involvement in postgraduate medical education, the universities were ultimately assigned this responsibility.

The first Annual Scientific Meeting of the college took place from 21st to 24th May 1993, marking a significant milestone in its academic engagement and professional development initiatives.



Donation of land & working together with the College of Surgeons to create the Academy of Medicine (1992)

One of the most transformative developments in the history of the College of Physicians was the working together with the College of surgeons to create the Academy of Medicine of Malaysia in 1992.

This decision, formalized on 23rd June 1992, was driven by the desire to foster greater integration, cooperation, and coordination of specialist activities within the country.

The College of Physicians and the College of Surgeons, together with the Academy of Family medicine physicians donated the land upon which the first Academy building was constructed along Jalan Tun Razak. This noble and grand gesture, in the greater interests of the medical profession, provided the impetus for the creation of the first home for the Academy of Medicine Malaysia.

This development strengthened the position of the college in the broader medical landscape and enhanced its capacity to support the professional growth of Malaysian physicians.

Till today, the College of Physicians remains a major voice in the Academy of medicine as well as in the management of the new Academy of medicine building in Putrajaya.





Modern Achievements and Initiatives

Since its inception, the college has evolved into a significant institution within the Malaysian medical community. Notable achievements and ongoing initiatives include:

Publication of The Internist

The college's official newsletter, providing regular updates and insights to members.

MRCP Courses and Examinations

The college has played a key role in organizing MRCP (Membership of the Royal Colleges of Physicians) courses and mock examinations in collaboration with the Royal College of Physicians, helping to maintain high standards in postgraduate medical training.

· Collaboration with the Ministry of Health (MOH)

The college has co-organized several conferences with the MOH, reinforcing its role in shaping national healthcare policies and standards.

Credentialing Physicians

Through the National Specialist Register (NSR), the college is actively involved in accrediting and credentialing physicians, ensuring the continued competence of specialists in various fields.

Sub-Specialty Engagement

The college has established sub-specialty chapters to promote collaboration and integration among different medical disciplines.

Educational Outreach

The college streams academic seminars in partnership with the Royal College of Physicians of Edinburgh and organizes "Saturday Teach-ins" aimed at medical students and junior doctors, reinforcing its commitment to high-quality medical education.

Fellowship and Awards

In 2015, the Fellowship of the College of Physicians, Academy of Medicine of Malaysia (FCPAMM) in Clinical Haematology was established, followed by the introduction of the Lifetime Achievement and Innovation Awards in 2016, with Dato' Dr. Amir Abbas and Tan Sri Dato' Seri Dr. Haji Ismail Merican as the first recipients.

INTRODUCTION OF

MALAYSIAN ADVANCED ACUTE INTERNAL MEDICINE AND ULTRASOUND SOCIETY (MAAIMUSS)

The Malaysian Association for Advancement in Internal Medicine, Ultrasound, and Systems Science (MAAIMUSS) is a pioneering professional body dedicated to elevating the standards of Advanced Acute Internal Medicine in Malaysia. Founded with the aim of integrating innovative diagnostic techniques and multidisciplinary approaches, MAAIMUSS focuses on the synergistic application of ultrasound technology and acute medicine within clinical practice. By promotting advanced education in Acute Medicine and clinical skills development, MAAIMUSS seeks to empower physicians and improve patient care outcomes.

Advanced Acute Internal Medicine has proved to be a gamechanger in Hospital care. In Malaysia, acute medicine has developed into a vital subspecialty focused on the rapid assessment and management of patients presenting with urgent, often life-threatening conditions. The field addresses the needs of complex and undifferentiated patients—those with unclear diagnoses who may present with multiple, overlapping symptoms.

Health care facilities that implement Acute medicine have reduced admission rates and have a shorter length of stay. The reduced length of stay contributes to less complications for the patients as well. For the hospital this leads to a lower bed occupancy rate and better utilisation of hospital resources. Ultimately this results in major cost savings for the government and improved delivery of healthcare.

A central pillar of MAAIMUSS is the advancement of ultrasound as a core diagnostic tool. MAAIMUSS supports this evolution by advocating for the use of point-of-care ultrasound, a critical tool in the hands of acute care physicians, aiding in the swift identification of underlying issues without the delay of traditional imaging

MAAIMUSS has introduced specialized training programs and workshops, helping clinicians adopt cutting-edge ultrasound techniques that enhance diagnostic accuracy and treatment decisions. These workshops first launched in 2020 during the height of the COVID pandemic revolutionised the way Point of Care Ultrasound was taught with online modules and remote mentoring. These workshops have been rolled out all over the country and have been very well received. In addition to ultrasound, MAAIMUSS has also led the way in developing Acute Clinical Skills workshops for medical officers and junior internal medicine specialists.

In recent years, MAAIMUSS has achieved notable milestones, including impactful research initiatives, collaborations with national and regional medical bodies, and contributions to the ASEAN healthcare community. Of note, MAAIMUSS has collaborated closely with Brunei, Singapore, Sri Lanka, Thailand and the UK in advancing the widespread adoption of Acute Medicine within ASEAN. Its efforts have positioned Malaysia as a leader in the region for Acute internal medicine, showcasing the country's commitment to excellence in clinical practice and patient care.





INTRODUCTION OF MALAYSIAN ASSOCIATION OF REHABILITATION PHYSICIANS (MARP)

The Malaysian Association of Rehabilitation Physicians (MARP), established in 2011, is dedicated to advancing rehabilitation medicine across Malaysia. With over 120 members MARP comprises rehabilitation physicians from both private and public sectors. MARP serves as a collaborative platform for enhancing care for individuals with disabilities and chronic illnesses.

The association emphasizes education, research, and advocacy to improve patient outcomes through interdisciplinary approaches. It organizes workshops, conferences, and training programs to keep members updated on the latest rehabilitation techniques and technologies. MARP also collaborates internationally with organizations such as Asian Rehabilitation Medicine Association, International Society of Physical and Rehabilitation Medicine, and Asia-Oceanian Society of Physical and Rehabilitation Medicine.

Additionally, it engages with policy makers to advocate for improved access to rehabilitation services nationwide. LIFETIME ACHIEVEMENT AWARD

DATO' DR ARIS CHANDRAN ABDULLAH

Citation by Dr Rafiz Abdul Rani

Dato' Dr. Aris Chandran Abdullah, also known as **Dato' Dr. Chandran Krishnan**, stands as a distinguished luminary within the Malaysian medical fraternity, celebrated for his profound contributions to clinical practice and medical education.

Graduating with an MBBS from Universiti Malaysia in 1979, Dato' Dr. Aris Chandran commenced his illustrious career at Hospital Ipoh (now Hospital Raja Permaisuri Bainun) as a house officer, medical officer, and registrar. His pursuit of excellence led him to Central Middlesex Hospital, London, where he gained invaluable experience under the mentorship of Dr. Martin McNicol and achieved Membership of the Royal College of Physicians. As a Consultant Physician, Dato' Dr. Aris Chandran played a pivotal role in enhancing the services at several key hospitals, including Hospital Kuala Kubu Baru, Hospital Pekan, Sarawak General Hospital, and Hospital Ipoh. Being the Head of Department of Medicine in the Hospital Ipoh; the State Hospital of Perak, his responsibilities involves advising the State Health Director and coordinating the Internal Medicine Specialty for the whole state. His guiding principle, "to facilitate, not frustrate," was instrumental during his tenure as Head of the Department of Medicine at Hospital Ipoh (1999 – 2014), fostering an environment where both physicians and healthcare professionals could thrive.

Dato' Dr Aris Chandran also had the distinct honour of serving as the personal physician to the Sultanate of Pahang Darul Makmur (1986-1988) and Sultanate of Perak Darul Ridzuan (1993-2014). He has chaired numerous prestigious conferences, including the National Infection Control Meeting, ASEAN Primary Care Conference, and SEAGMA Annual Scientific Meeting. Presently, Dato' Dr. Aris Chandran serves as an Associate Professor at UniKL – Royal College of Medicine Perak, where he continues to inspire through his passion for teaching and his impressive portfolio of research and publications. An avid badminton player since his university days, Dato' Dr. Aris Chandran remains active in sports, serving as the Vice President of the Perak Badminton Association and striving to achieve a single handicap in golf.

His illustrious career began with a medical degree from Monash University, Australia, followed by a Master of Medicine from the National University of Singapore in 1989. He was the pioneer of the Master of Medicine in Malaysia, where he earned the degree in 1991. His distinguished career includes a research fellowship at the Hospital for Neurology & Neurosurgery, Queen Square, London, before completing an MD in Neurology from Monash University.

Prof. Dato' Dr. Raymond has been instrumental in advancing epilepsy treatment in Malaysia. His unwavering dedication to clinical practice and academic excellence is reflected in his extensive publication record, comprising over 100 journal papers and clinical practice guidelines. He is a highly sought-after speaker, sharing his profound knowledge, experience and research insights both locally and internationally.

His exemplary leadership is evident in his current role as Chairman of the UiTM Research Ethics Committee, and his previous positions as Chairman of the Malaysian Epilepsy Council, Chairman of the Conjoint Board of Master of Medicine, and Dean and Hospital Director of Universiti Kebangsaan Malaysia to name just a few.
