WAKE SOIL & WATER SUPERVISOR SCOTT LASSITER RUNNING FOR NC HOUSE 21

CARY, NC- Lifelong Wake County resident, school administrator, and current countywide elected official Scott Lassiter has officially launched his campaign for the newly drawn, and currently empty, NC House District 21. It encompasses communities in Apex, Cary, Fairview, Fuquay-Varina, Garner, Holly Springs, Raleigh, and Swift Creek.

Lassiter has already been successfully fundraising and suring up supporters across his district and the state. He noted, “After redistricting was completed the opportunity presented itself for me to run in an open seat to represent a portion of the county that either myself or a member of my immediate family has called home for over 65 consecutive years.”

No stranger to public service, Lassiter previously served 4 years on the Apex Town Council before his election to his current post. He has volunteered extensively in his community as his HOA president, a member of the board of directors for Kids Together Playground, and as the president and founder of the Lassiter Education Foundation for the benefit of at-risk students.

Lassiter points to his unique background by saying, “The fact is there is a lack of public education experience and knowledge in the General Assembly. As a practicing public school administrator at a school specially designed to support at-risk students, no one on Jones Street has the unique perspective, education, or experiences that I will bring to the discussion. I am ready to serve.”

With an undergraduate degree from NC State in education, a master’s from NC Central in school administration, and a doctoral degree in educational leadership from NC State in progress, Lassiter will be not only able to contribute to the conversation around NC’s public schools from a professional perspective but also as an academic.

The campaign has promised to work tirelessly to attack problems, not people, both now and once elected. Policy will focus on what Lassiter knows best, education, infrastructure, and economic opportunity.

Lassiter spoke optimistically about his chances in the primary on March 8th, “There are plenty of folks who can talk-the-talk but our district's savvy voters are looking for someone who has walked-the-walk. I know our best days can be ahead of us and I will use common-sense conservatism to make that a reality.”
