OSPA STEPS UP

The Oakdale Animal Shelter was relatively quiet through 2020 and 2021. As always, there were still animals in need and OSPA stepped up to help in several ways.

1. Paying for veterinary and grooming services that are not covered by the shelter.
2. Offering promotions for dogs that may be harder to place or where the adoption fees are an issue.
3. An ongoing grant was awarded to the shelter to lower the cost of cat adoptions. This has been proven to be invaluable for getting cats adopted.
4. Gifts of money were awarded to various rescue groups who take animals from the shelter. Since there were no in-person adoption events, OSPA wisely used funds to help those rescues with expenses so they will be able to help in the

future.

Dumped, scared and traumatized by hunger, heat, thunder and lightning, the young female pit bull evaded capture in Riverbank for a week. A good samaritan was able to get a leash on her and OSPA member Debi Scoles took her home for the weekend. Initially she was too exhausted and frightened to do anything but rest, but it was immediately clear she was a gem.

Gentle and quiet, Grace blossomed at the shelter with attention and care. A lovely family in Stockton had recently lost an older pet and had been watching for just the right dog to welcome into the family, and once they saw Grace they were sure she was the one! At the family's first shelter visit, Grace was timid and scared, but the family was undaunted and made a return visit the next day. This time Grace recognized she could trust and love back. Her troubles weren't quite over however, as she needed extensive surgery to clear up



an abdominal foxtail infection. OSPA voted to pay for all the surgical expenses, as well as assisting with her adoption fee so Grace could begin her new life. She has been renamed Gracie and has a very special dog friend named Mabel at her new residence, along with a senior chihuahua, 3 cats, 6 chickens, 2 teenagers, and a three year old!
