Coping with COVID-19 at SVDP

The Belleville Council Society of St. Vincent de Paul is adhering to all regulatory mandates for dealing with the COVID-19 pandemic. We have SUSPENDED all normal operations at the SVdP Main Office and Outreach Ministry Building, are enforcing social distancing, requiring masks and gloves when indicated and following all standards for cleaning and disinfecting.

ALL home visits are suspended. Conference members are responding to requests via the phone and text.

ALL meetings are suspended until further notice including all Council Meetings & Conference Meetings. ALL Vincentian gatherings are suspended until further notice.

The St. Vincent de Paul Office at 13 Vieux Carre is closed to all volunteers and is staffed by only the executive director and the bookkeeper for operational essentials. All programs at the office are suspended until further notice. The Officers are available by phone and email for all other business. The office is open 9am - 2pm for donation drop-offs on Mondays, Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Fridays, as well as by appointment.

The Soup Buses are out of service until further notice.

The Outreach Ministry Building at 3718 State is CLOSED to everyone except the executive director and 5 staff members. The Soup Kitchen, Thrift Store, Help Center, and all programs associated with the Outreach Ministry Center are suspended until further notice pending the mandates regarding the coronavirus pandemic. No volunteers are permitted in the building. Donation drop-offs are accepted Monday through Friday 8am to 1:30 pm, Saturdays 9 to noon and by appointment.

We are currently disinfecting the entire main Outreach Ministry building.

While the Soup Kitchen is closed, staff prepares sack lunches for daily distribution according to mandates set forth by East Side Health District.

Easter Dinner at the Soup Kitchen is cancelled. We will be providing EASTER DINNER BAGS!

The Drop-In Center remains open 7pm to 7am daily to serve the homeless in St. Clair County and adheres to all required mandates. We provide a sack lunch in the evening and a sack breakfast at 7am. Staff members follow a rigorous daily schedule to disinfect and sanitize the building 7 days a week. The County has advised us that they want us to remain open during this crisis to provide respite to the homeless. We are praying Psalm 91 each night and invite you to share that prayer to invoke God's protection upon the Drop-In Center and the St. Vincent de Paul Outreach. We MUST stay healthy to continue this ministry.

These are painful times and it has been very difficult to suspend vital programs but we are trying to still meet critical needs of the poor. Our 5 staff personnel are doing an incredible job and I am so grateful.

Success Story...

While our Council can herald the successes of many of our clients, a recent article in the Messenger featured one of our most cherished. We are so grateful to the Messenger for highlighting our work. Following is the article reprinted with permission.

Long-time Homeless Woman Credits St. Vincent de Paul for New Start

Cindy K. doesn't mince words when it comes to her feelings for the Belleville Council of St. Vincent de Paul. "I owe my life to St. Vincent de Paul," she says.

Cindy (she asked that we not use her last name) was for many years a successful, highly ambitious woman with a good job, a nice house, a garage full of tools and a nice car.

"I was living the American dream," she recalls.

Then, through no fault of her own, Cindy's life took a sudden turn for the worse. Cindy suffered through three separate cancer diagnoses. Doctors prescribed opioids for the pain, and as is so often the case, she became addicted to the medication.

Like many people addicted to opioids, the drugs completely took over her life.

"I lost everything, my family, friends, my former self," she says.

For years Cindy's life consisted of a desperate routine of searching for a little food and a safe place to sleep for the night. One year, she slept in her car at the Flying J truck stop west of Belleville.

"Living on the street is an experience that will stay with me forever," Cindy says.

Then one day Cindy just happened to walk into St. Vincent de Paul's Cosgrove's Kitchen on State Street in East St. Louis.

"I went in for a hot meal and that experience changed my life," she says.

At St. Vincent de Paul, which is a recipient of funding from the Catholic Service and Ministry Appeal, Cindy met caring, dedicated and selfless people who saw in her, not just someone down on her luck, but the face of Jesus.

Cindy met with Pat Hogrebe, executive Director of St. Vincent de Paul, Belleville Council. "She took the time to talk to me," Cindy says. "Pat sees the good in everyone and she sees the potential in everyone."

With the help of St. Vincent de Paul staff, Cindy saw the opportunity to turn her life around and start anew.

St. Vincent de Paul fed me, clothed me and gave me the resources to pull myself up and off the street," she says.

Cindy worked with – among others – Evelyn Weber, a long-time St. Vincent volunteer who was instrumental in helping Cindy re-engage with the workforce.

"Evelyn is our number one volunteer with the JOBSKILLS Program and has tons of experience," Pat says.

Pat, Evelyn, and others helped Cindy with bus tickets so that she could get her license renewed, helped get her car repaired, provided food to get her through some tough days, as well as clean clothes and shoes. They also arranged classes in money management and how to search for employment.

With the help of Pat Hogrebe and her dedicated volunteers, Cindy soon landed an internship with a local manufacturing company.

But even with all that help, getting her life back was no cakewalk for Cindy.

"Coming off the street I really had to prove myself and St. Vincent de Paul helped me every step of the way," she says.

After a period of six months Cindy became a full-time employee of the company. Today, several years later, Cindy is a vital part of the company's operation. She now works in a division of the company that breeds, raises, and trains show dogs. She says it is her dream job.

"Every day I thank Jesus for bringing me to St. Vincent de Paul, Pat Hogrebe, and her wonderful volunteers.
