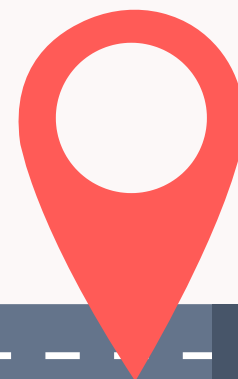

TEST TIPS!

Over the summer, **re-cap on all reasoning question types** and focus on those you find hard. **Start timing yourself:** allow 40 seconds for non-verbal & spatial, and 30 seconds for verbal questions.

Look through maths questions and identify your **quickest method to solve**. Ensure you know your **times tables** (counting in 25s is also helpful) and fraction/decimal/percentage equivalents)

Read widely. **Explore new vocabulary:** look up words, find their definition, word class, and any synonyms and antonyms. If you can apply the word to your own sentence, you've probably learnt the meaning!
