NEW TO THE INDUSTRY?

If you are brand new to the industry, you will need to qualify as a lifeguard by completing the STA Award in Pool Lifeguarding qualification.

This qualification is designed to train learners in pool rescue, CPR techniques, first aid, and dealing with poolside emergencies in accordance with National Occupational Standards, Managing Health and Safety in Swimming Pools, British Standard BS EN 15288 Part 2 Safety Requirements for Operations, and the CIMSPA Employer Led Professional Standards – Pool Lifeguard.


To attend a course, you will need to:

- Be 16 years, or older, at the point of assessment
- Be able to jump into deep water
- Be able to swim 50 metres in under 1 minute
- Be able to swim 100 metres on the front and 100 metres on the back without stopping
- Be able to tread water for 30 seconds in deep water
- Be able to surface dive and recover an object from the deepest part of the pool
- Be able to climb out of the pool unaided without the use of steps or ladders.

EARNING POTENTIAL

As with any other job, income for lifeguards can vary according to age, geographical location, skills, and experience. Lifeguards are typically paid by the hour and rates can start from the national minimum wage, £5.00 to £12+.

Lifeguards can progress after gaining experience, further training, and qualifications into tutoring, leisure or operations management, swimming teaching, pool plant operations, first aider, open water lifesaving, gym instructing, or even as a steppingstone into medical service roles.

ROLES OF A LIFEGUARD INCLUDE:

- Being professional
- Observing and supervising pool users
- Intervening and preventing accidents
- Communicating with pool users
- Checking and maintaining rescue equipment
- Carrying out rescues
- Administering first aid and CPR
- Cleaning and maintaining the building
- Setting up and taking down for sessions.

STEP TWO FIND AN STA AWARD IN POOL LIFEGUARDING COURSE

Your next step is to enrol on to an Award in Pool Lifeguarding course developed by Safety Training Awards (STA) awarding organisation whose qualifications are endorsed by CIMSPA (Chartered Institute for the Management of Sport and Physical Activity).

STEP THREE FIND EMPLOYMENT

After you have qualified, you can apply to work as lifeguard.

STA has partnered with Leisure Opportunities to bring you the latest job vacancies for lifeguards across the country and internationally.

Many lifeguards start their career by securing work with leisure centres or with private pool operators, hotels, health clubs, etc to gain experience.

As a qualified lifeguard, you will need to maintain occupational competency by undertaking regular ongoing training.

This is usually organised by the employer and covers elements of the theory, CPR, first aid, and pool skills including 'real life' scenarios, site-specific content, and fitness training.

You will also need to re-take the Pool Lifeguarding assessment every 3 years.

CREATING YOUR CV

Your CV is the first point of contact between you and an employer. Precise content, a clear structure and a clean design will help you make an impact.

- Keep your CV to a maximum of 2 pages
- Stick to one clear font such as Times New Roman
- Always use subheadings for different sections e.g. Personal Statement, Work Experience, Education, Key Skills, Interests and References
- Research the company you are applying for and adapt your CV accordingly.
