The Core POWARR Skills



The **POWARR** skills are six core skills that promote communication, collaboration, critical-thinking, and creativity to increase student engagement through rigorous and meaningful learning experiences in all content areas.



POWARR Skill #1: Predict

What do you *think* will happen?



POWARR Skill #2: Observe

What *info* can you gather using your senses or from the resources provided?



How will you describe this investigation/project so that it can be duplicated?



POWARR Skill #4: Analyze

Do you notice any patterns or *trends* in the data/research?



POWARR Skill #5: Research

What topics do you need to know more about?



POWARR Skill #6: Report

What do the *results* of this investigation/project suggest?

When should you use **POWARR**?

When should your students need to solve a problem or are working on lessons/activities that don't have one specific right or wrong answer.

Examples of how to use POWARR across content areas:

ELA: Connecting themes from a particular genre of literature or author to a current event

Science: Planning a science experiment

Social Studies: Problem- or project-based learning experiences

Math: Applying mathematical data to real-life situations
