Leps win showdown with Hillers

Coming into its game against unbeaten Trinity, the Belle Vernon Area girls soccer team knew there was a battle brewing.

Trinity was unbeaten, but the Leopards knew why — they hadn't played them yet.

BVA got on the board first and used three goals in a span of 17 minutes to race out to a 3-0 halftime lead en route to a 6-2 Section 2-3A win and remain one game behind first-place Connellsville in the section standings.

"This was a huge win for us and we needed it," BVA head coach Tracy Lovett said. "We've been preparing for this game and really looking forward to it. I think we had a little chip on our shoulder because it's like some people forgot about us in the section."

Jillian Butchki finished with a hat trick, with all the goals coming in the second half, and Izzy Laurita scored

both of her goals in the first half to lead the Leopards (5-1, 4-1).

While the Hillers (4-1, 4-1) got a pair of second-half goals from Alyssa Clutter, they were stymied from

many others by BVA goalkeeper Grace Henderson.

Just hours after winning a cross-country race, Henderson finished with eight saves, some spectacular, showing off her range and athleticism.

"Grace was fantastic tonight," Lovett said. "As far as this season goes, this was her biggest test and she passed it with flying colors. She made some great, athletic saves tonight."

Henderson's biggest save was made on a hard shot as she dove to her right to get a body on a hard shot from the center of the box.

"She really showed off her athleticism today and I think that's going to give her even more confidence as we move later in the season," Lovett said.

The Leopards peppered Hillers' freshman goalie Ruby Morgan with 15 shots on goal and fired 29 shots toward the net.

"We won this game in the midfield and had a lot of great chances offensively," Lovett said. "I think our speed in our front seven really caused a lot of problems for them on their back line."

Eimodshofer, who got the first goal after a throw-in and nice cross from Victoria Rodriguez, picked up two assists in the win. Kaitara Rhodes had two assists and Farrah Reader added a helper on a Butchki goal.

"I thought despite the rain and a slippery surface, we were really crisp on the ball. We did a good job of keeping our shape and formation for the most part, when we didn't, that's when they got their goals," Lovett said.

"But they're a good team. We knew we had to be careful with the Clutter girl. She's a great athlete. Those are things we're going to look at."

It looks as though BVA survived a scare when Laurita went down with an apparent leg injury with eight minutes remaining in the game. She was down for some time on the sideline and a cart was brought on to the field. But the senior got up and eventually walked to the bench under her own power and stayed with her team.

Another detail the Leopards don't want to look too much into is a retribution game Monday against Connellsville. There's still work to do with a game at Laurel Highlands Thursday and a rivalry game at Ringgold Saturday.

"We definitely have a point to prove in that game, but we still have two more before we get there," Lovett said. "We can't look ahead. This game was a tone-setter and it started with that first goal. We need to keep that chip on our shoulder and take care of business in these next two games."

Bearcats topple Cougars for sixth straight victory

Since dropping down to Class A in 2018, the Bentworth girls soccer team has dominated in four meetings with Charleroi.

The Bearcats swept the season series in each of the last two years, outscoring the Cougars, 36-0.

While it wasn't the same dominant performance put on display in years past, Bentworth was once again on the winning side against its Section 2-A rivals Tuesday, capturing a 6-1 victory over visiting Charleroi at Bentworth Athletic Field.

Reagan Schreiber netted a hat trick, while Mackenzie Buttermore, Mallory Schreiber and Emily Kisner add-

ed one goal apiece to help the Bearcats (6-2, 4-2) extend their winning streak to six games.

"It was a tough one, but we knew that ultimately our depth was going to take over at some point," said Bentworth head coach Tyler Hamstra, whose team held a slim 2-1 lead at halftime. "Charleroi is a really good team and this is the time of year when the attrition battle starts getting you. You always have to have it in your mind that it's a marathon."

Despite seeing her team take the loss, Charleroi head coach Traci Fleming applauded the effort, especially in the first half.

The Cougars (2-6, 2-4) were able to collect 11 of their 12 shots in the opening 40 minutes. One of those shots came on their lone goal of the game by freshman Bella Carroto.

"That was probably the best

40 minutes of soccer we've been able to put together, but unfortunately, it's an 80-minute game," Fleming said.

"We've come a long way from game one to that first half, we just get tired and get worn out as the game goes on. They knew how to play us and they knew they were going to wear us out in the first half and come get us in the second half."

Charleroi was able to get five total shots within the first 10 minutes of play, but they weren't quality chances, sailing either wide of the net or directly at Bentworth goalkeeper Jasmine Manning. Manning had five saves in the win.

Bentworth, which claimed the program's 150th win Tuesday, picked up its first shot with just under 30 minutes on the clock as Mallory Schreiber lifted one that was

Defense, Pritts' hat trick lead Yough past Elizabeth Forward

It has been an up-and-down start to the 2020 season for the reigning WPIAL Class 2A runners-up from Yough.

Finding the right mix of players to replace a slew of graduated talent has been a difficult task; however, if the second half of their nonsection matchup against Elizabeth Forward Tuesday is any indication, the Cougars could very well be on the verge of bouncing back.

A smothering defense and a hat trick from sophomore McKenzie Pritts helped propel Yough to a 5-2 victory over the neighboring Warriors on Cougar Mountain.

Junior Hannah Biros also had a strong game for the Cougars (5-3) with two assists.

"I think the second half of tonight's game was probably one of our better halves all season," Yough head coach Dann Appolonia said. "We're putting together the passes and we're on target. We were finding open players, making nice runs and finishing, which has been a struggle for us all year."

EF (3-3) had trouble penetrating the Cougars' midfield and defense most of the night.

The two times they got through, Natalie Beinlich was able to get goals. There were not many other scoring chances for the Warriors.

"We were not getting as many looks as I would like but there were many times we had players wide open and we just could not get the ball to them," Elizabeth Forward head coach Brandon Gerba said. "Kudos to Yough, they look a lot better than what they've shown. They look like they are starting to click a little bit."

Pritts and Biros connected on three occasions. Biros set up two of Pritts' markers before Pritts returned the favor on another goal.

"(Pritts and Biros) definitely were a good combination tonight, we have been waiting for that to happen all year," Appolonia said. "It has taken us three to four games to figure out what kind of formation we were going to use and where people were

going to fit best. In the past two or three games, we have figured out what seems to be working for us."

Elizabeth Forward opened the scoring in the 14th minute as Beinlich took a pass from Natalie Moffa and blasted a shot from 25 yards out. The shot snuck in just under the center of the crossbar and over the outstretched hands of Yough keeper Marin Sleith for a 1-0 EF lead.

Yough answered quickly just three minutes later. Biros booted a corner kick into the box and the ball was knocked home by Natalie Vilchek, tying the score 1-1.

The Cougars kept the pressure on as Vilchek put a pass down the middle and Pritts beat a Warrior defender to the ball. Pritts entered into the box and sent a low roller past a diving Jordan Cochenour to give Yough a 2-1 advantage that carried into halftime.

EF tied the game thanks to a holding call in the goalkeepers box against the Cougars. Beinlich shot low to the right for the penalty kick goal in the 47th minute.

The game remained at a stalemate until the 60th minute. Biros carried the ball deep into Warrior territory and sent a cross out in front of the net. Cochenour came out to challenge and

saved by Charleroi keeper Addison Conrad, who finished with four stops.
