Ringgold celebrates seniors by downing AG

Senior Faith Bodnar scored a pair of goals in the first half of a 4-1 triumph over Albert Gallatin.

The Ringgold girls soccer team celebrated senior night with a 4-1 victory over visiting Albert Gallatin in Section 2-3A play Thursday at Joe Montana Stadium.

Four members of the Class of 2021 were honored before the game and one of those seniors had herself a performance to remember.

Faith Bodnar scored two first-half goals and just missed out on a third for Ringgold (3-3, 3-3). Both Bodnar tallies were set up by sophomore Katelyn Ferrence who had a goal of her own as well.

"Every win is important to me, it affects how we move as a team, how we work as a team and how we are off the field as well as on it," Bodnar said. "The win tonight just gets us one step closer to the playoffs."

Bodnar and her teammates played a good game, but, according to her, not good enough. Ringgold coach Olivia Wilkerson agreed.

"We really connected as a team, there were a few breakdowns," Bodnar said. "We'll fix it. There's always room for improvement and we know what we need to do."

"Like Bodnar said, we had some breakdowns but we fixed them," Wilkerson said. "We came out on top. This team just has a way about them, it might take a conversation but they bounce back and figure it out."

One of the adjustments that occurred was on the Rams' back line.

There were some miscues back there; however, Ringgold's players figured it out and readjusted.

"They had some breakdowns tonight, which is uncharacteristic of this team, and I watched and listened to Morgan Walsh just controlling the back line," Wilkerson said. "She just

grabbed an older player and helped her with her position. When we can do that from the back, it flows all the way up to the front."

Ringgold got started early in the game as Ferrence fired a shot off the cross bar and Bodnar knocked it home in the fourth minute for a 1-0 lead.

In the seventh minute, the Rams had a goal nullified on an offside call.

Then in the 17th minute, Ferrence put one in off a feed from Aubrey Esper to push the lead to two.

Three minutes later, Ferrence was tripped in the box, which set up senior Madison Bailey with a penalty kick. Despite the prime opportunity, her shot sailed just high of the cross bar.

"(Bailey) is a great ball player and she is

definitely kicking herself for missing that PK," Wilkerson said. "But then she came flying from the back line on some overlapping runs and I thought she was going to score that way. Apparently she really just likes to work for it."

Ferrence found Bodnar again in the 23rd minute on a nice clean pass for a 3-0 Rams

Brandon Gerba knew his team was in for a good performance before the game even started.

The day before, the Elizabeth Forward girls soccer team had one of their better, harder practices. And on Thursday, that practice play carried over, as the Warriors dominated Keystone Oaks in a 5-0 Section 4-2A victory at Warrior Stadium.

"We focused on all-out effort. Speed of play has been kind of off for us this year. We've had days when we practiced slow and we played slow, and it shows," said Gerba, the Warriors' coach. "So yesterday was probably one of the harder practices that they had in

awhile, effort wise. And it showed tonight with more effort and more speed."

Elizabeth Forward (4-3, 4-1) controlled play from start to finish, peppering 16 shots on net. Keystone Oaks (2-5, 2-4) finished with just four shots.

Four different girls scored for the Warriors, with Natalie Moffa getting two and Natalie Beinlich, Anna Resnik and Brianna Hartford each getting one a piece.

Conversely, Keystone Oaks rarely threatened, meandering on offense and never really getting the ball in dangerous spots.

After a 7-0 loss to South Park and a 5-2 loss to Yough, it was exactly the type of rebound performance Elizabeth Forward was looking for.

The last time the Charleroi girls faced Chartiers-Houston, the Cougars were blasted 7-0.

Charleroi wanted a little redemption the second time around when the teams faced off Thursday at Myron Pottios Stadium.

The Cougars didn't get the result they wanted but the young team showed they're

going to be a force to be reckoned with in years to come.

Seconds after Bella Carroto sent a 25-yard blast into the back of the net to tie the game, Chartiers-Houston's Ashley Horvath scored off a long rebound to give the Bucs a 5-4 win over the Cougars.

"This is definitely one of those games I have a lot of confidence that we win as soon as next season," Charleroi coach Traci Fleming said. "These are some of the growing pains I knew we were going to go through, but this is one of those games that a young team will learn how to win."

The game mirrored the first meeting between the two teams as the Cougars (2-7, 2-5) had the better play and a number of opportunities to put the ball in the back of the net early.

Two balls were sent just wide of the goal and the Cougars hit two posts before Chartiers-Houston got the opening goal.

A ball sent in caught Charleroi goalkeeper Addison Conrad with the slightest hesitation to come to the top of the box and challenge the play, but the Bucs' Alyssa Wright just put enough of a bump on the ball allowing

it to slowly roll into the back of the net for a 1-0 lead.

"That's an experience thing, for sure," Fleming said. "Addison is a new keeper and she made some really good saves for us tonight. But there were little things like that play on the first goal and just holding on to the ball. There were two goals she had in her hands that squirted out and they scored on."

Boots DeUnger, another of the Cougars' strong freshman class, got her team on the board after taking a great pass from Carroto, rolling a shot past C-H keeper Madison Smith at the 20:45 mark.

"Boots is going to be one of the best to ever come out of this valley," Fleming said. "She's a little banged up, but it doesn't matter because she's going to go out there and play. She was great in the midfield tonight and Bella was great finishing."

Just 1:31 later, it was Carroto gathering a loose ball and scoring to vault the Cougars to a 2-1 lead with 19:14 left in the half.

"We have three freshmen that can really go out there and play great soccer," Fleming said, mentioning defender Taylor Ramsdell along with Carroto and DeUnger. "This is frustrating for them, I know that. They're not used to losing. I don't like to lose, either. But watching them improve every game is so exciting for me."

"We have four other freshmen out there starting that haven't even played before. Once they start coming along we're going to be really good and tough to stop."

team," Gerba said. "It was nice for them to come out and play the way that they did."

The Warriors first got on the board when Moffa scored in the eighth minute off of a cross. About 14 minutes later, Beinlich fired a strike from about 25 yards out into the net. Taking a 2-0 lead into the break, Moffa scored her second goal in the 45th minute, while Resnik scored in the 53rd minute and Hartford the 58th.

"What we've been working on is getting the forwards to check back and play back to the center mids, to play back to Natalie Beinlich, to play back to Abigail Beinlich, and play off of them," Gerba said. "Getting them to actually come back and find feet as opposed to dumping it all the time is something we've been working on pretty much all season, and it's starting to show in these last couple of games."

By playing off of the Beinlich sisters, the offense opened up. For the most part, Natalie Beinlich has carried the scoring load for the Warriors this season. But on Thursday, Eliz-

abeth Forward showed more offensive diversity.

"You don't want to be so one dimensional, but up to this point, Beinlich has had a great season, and everybody tends to focus on her. So when two or three other girls can share, it does help open up options for us and it gets more people involved and people can't just focus on her," Gerba said. "And it gives her more freedom too when they have to worry about two or three girls."

Defensively, Gerba said the strategy was to press a bit more and play tighter instead of so spread out. The Warriors executed it well, and turned defense into offense regularly. From top to bottom, it was a performance to build on, and the Warriors will hope to do that when they travel to Deer Lakes on Saturday.

"We still have a long way to go," Gerba said. "We have a lot to work on to compete with the top teams in 2A, but they played better as a unit tonight no matter who was in there, and I was happy with that."
