

Roof Ventilation – Some Illustrations

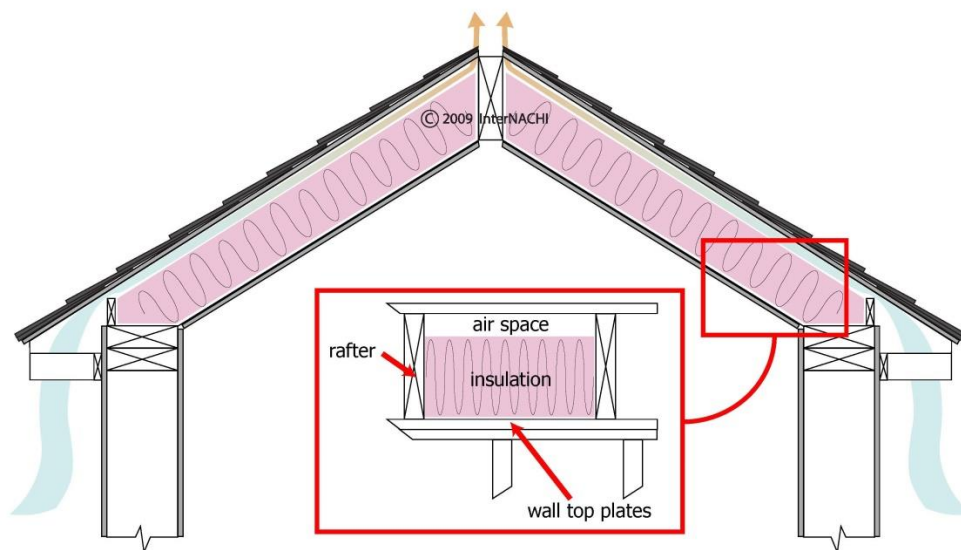
All images below are copyrighted from the InterNACHI image library. These images show some of the methods used to ventilate the roof/attic space. Note that they also show the spaces with insulation.

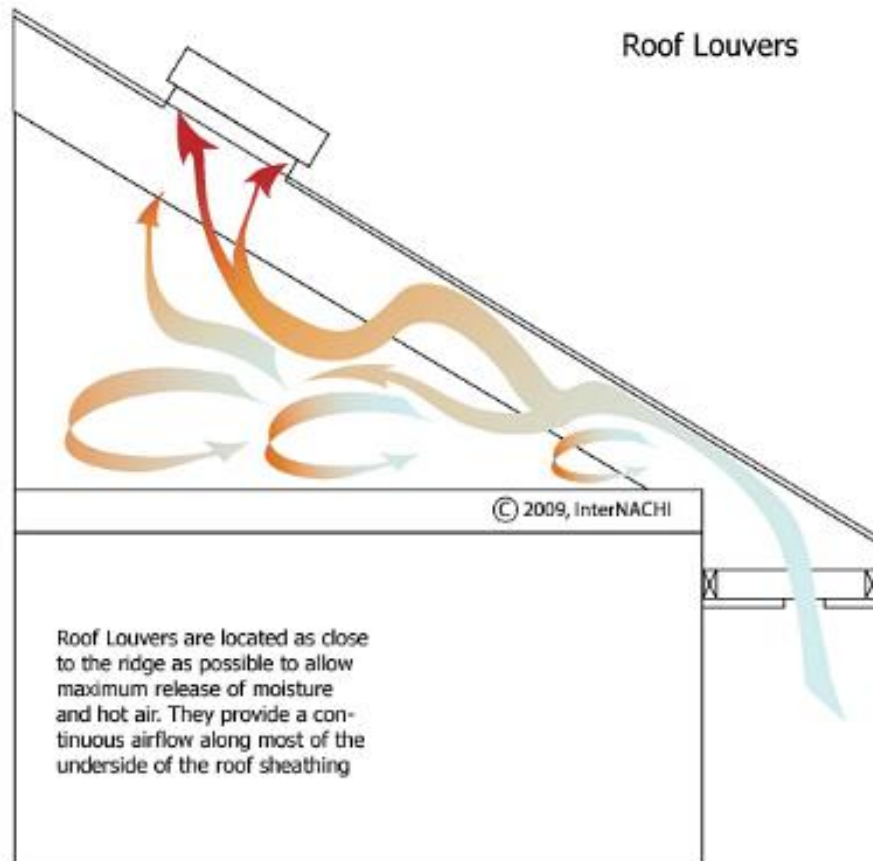

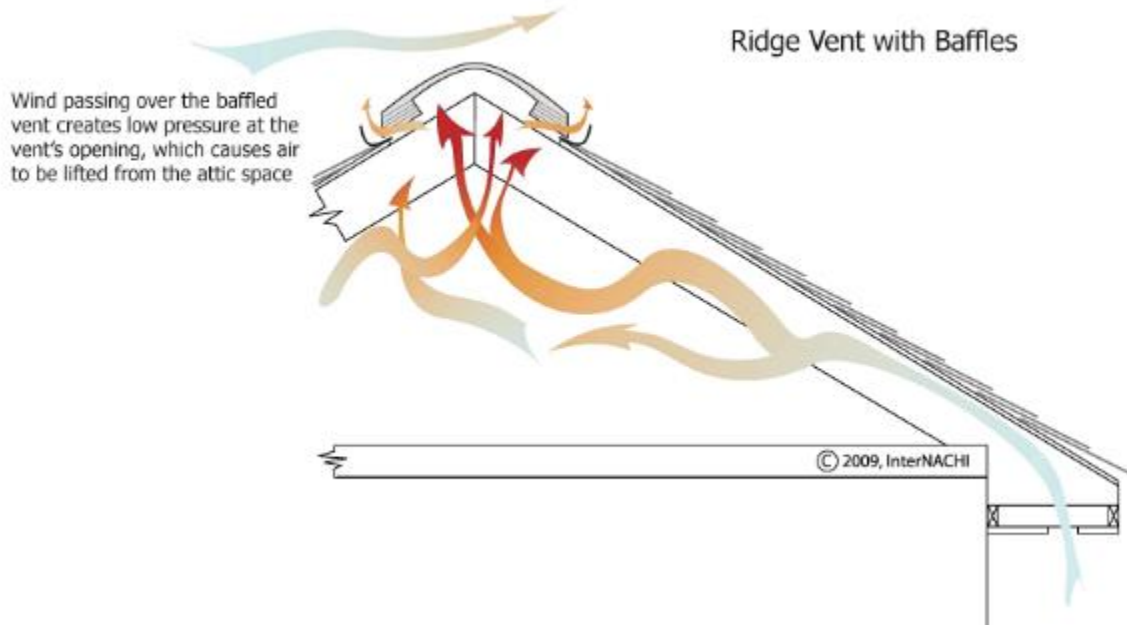
Roof Louvers

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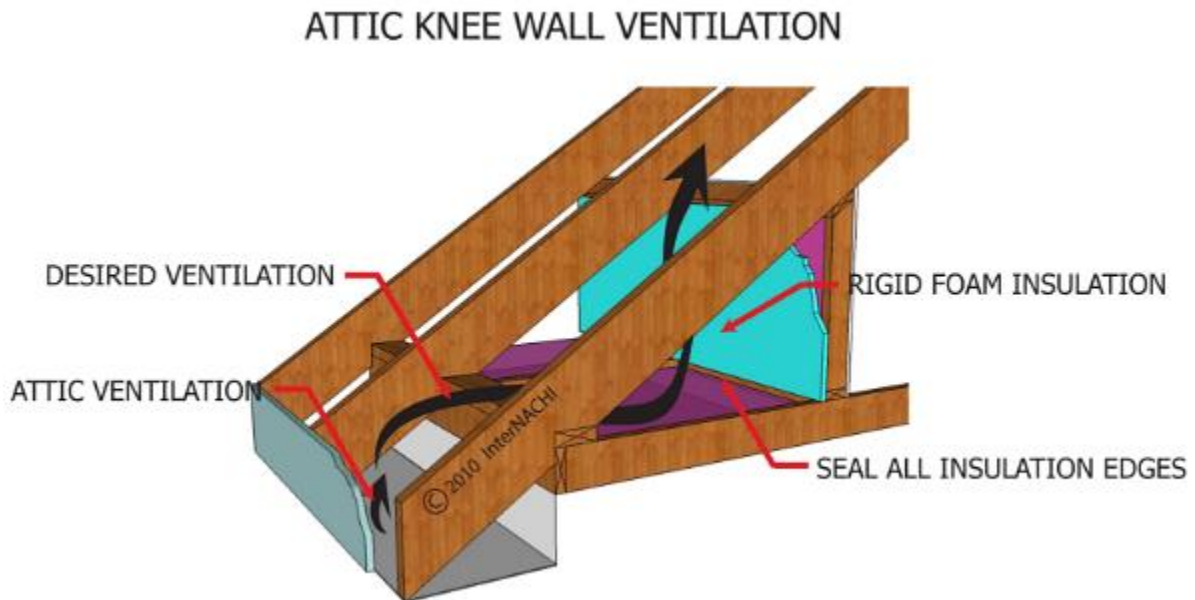
Ridge Vent with Baffles

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Attic Knee Wall Vent

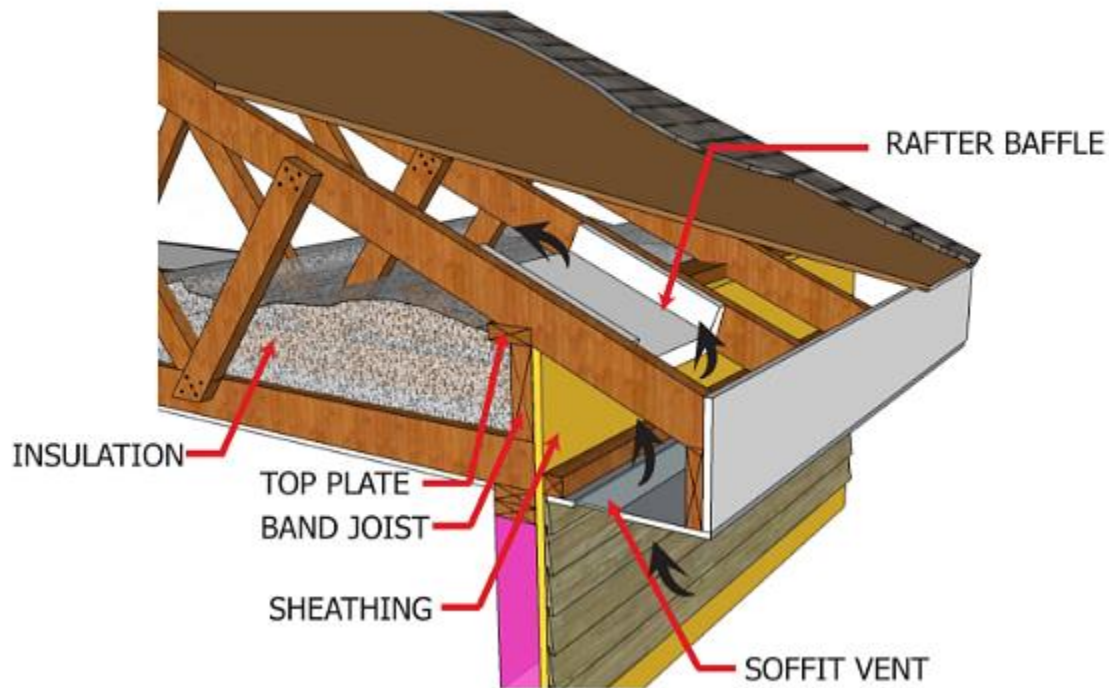
