Government/Guests Reports to the Board

<u>King County Sheriff's Office:</u> Sargent Tommy Collins Home video security cameras help solve crimes. Consider picture quality when purchasing a camera.

King County Local Services & Public Works Department: Director John Taylor King County awarded HOA \$3,790 for Last Splash picnic.

Department handles roads, building permits, and help to navigate issues regarding other departments. A representative will be at the Fairwood Library from 3:00 – 6:00 p.m. on Wednesdays.

A comprehensive plan and many questions are being reviewed regarding the proposed asphalt plant on Highway 169. No decision will be made for several months.

The roundabout construction took longer than planned because of a need to redesign the project for bus traffic.

Solid waste disposal will not likely be converted to waste energy. These projects are more effective in a city.

There are no immediate annexation plans for the area. The financial incentives for the cities to annex expired.

King County passed legislation to pay nonprofit groups to deal with homelessness.

Department may conduct a traffic study regarding the excessive traffic from library and retirement home onto 140 Ave SE.

Department will investigate the condition of sidewalks. Road projects are determined based on a risk based approach.

Public Health was activated almost a month ago regarding the coronavirus outbreak. We have talented health professionals, including a nationally recognized epidemiologist.
