### Security Committee Report: Jack Bramson

The King County Sheriff's Office performed numerous dedicated patrols in Fairwood Greens. These patrols are intended to emphasize high visibility for law enforcement as well as traffic enforcement. The Covid-19 situation, that resulted is school closures, resulted is less school zone traffic enforcement efforts. These patrols did result in the following stats:

#### 52 citizen contacts

- 11 Traffic (moving violation) warnings
- 1 NOI (traffic citation) issued
- 3 nighttime patrols performed (after 10:00 pm)
