## Security Committee Report: Jack Bramson

Due to the ongoing Covid 19 pandemic and Stay Home/Stay Healthy order, the KCSO is continuing to be prevented from performing any off duty special patrols. This is by order of the King County Sheriff and will continue until further notice. Therefore, there are no KCSO stats to report for this period.

The Securitas security weekly reports do not show any trends of significance in any of the reporting categories. There has been a slight uptick in noise complaints which is not unusual when weather improves, and the days are longer.

Additionally, we are in the process of resolving the contract billing disparity with Securitas. This should be resolved and agreed upon by our scheduled meeting date.

The FGHA again asks that any homeowner that is a victim of any crime, that they report it to the KCSO regardless of the type or severity. Even the smallest reports of minor theft, property damage, trespassing, etc., should be reported as the amount of reported activity is what influences patrol and resource deployment decisions.

#### External Affairs Report: Cathryn Hummel

On January 21, 2020, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and Washington State Department of Health announced the first case of 2019 Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19) in the United States in Washington State. On 3/23/2020, Gov. Jay Inslee issued a Stay Home, Stay Healthy order for two weeks to help curb the spread of the virus requiring everyone to stay home unless they need to pursue an essential activity.
