Security Committee: Jack Bramson

The following is the Security Committee Report for the May 2017 reporting period:

The King County Sheriff's Dept. performed 13 dedicated Fairwood Greens during the period of 4/23 through 5/15 which resulted in the following:

- 3 Notices of Infraction issued for moving violations
- 22 Traffic related warnings issued
- 17 Parking related warnings/contacts
- 20 Citizen contacts
- 3 Other incidents including patrol assists

The Securitas security service report showed no significant trend increase/decrease in any reporting category with the exception of vehicle prowls/break-ins.

The FGHOA Board/Security Committee has requested that the KCSO perform at least four dedicated patrol shifts (25% of each month's activity) between the hours of 2200 - 0600. KCSO has agreed and this should start during the month of June.

External Affairs: Diana Garcia

King County officials held their annual Community Service Area (CSA) Open House on Tuesday, May 9th. The meeting, hosted by Councilman Reagan Dunn's office, was well-attended by Fairwood residents and many King County officials were present, including the Assessor, County Budget Director, Sheriff, and representatives from the Department of Transportation, Natural Resources, Permitting & Environmental Review, Law Enforcement Oversight, Public Health & Human Services, and Emergency Management.

- John Wilson provided an overview of the Assessor's office, which is responsible for over 700,000 parcels of property (both residential and commercial) in King County. He indicated that the current issues for the Assessor's office include Senior exemptions and housing affordability. Low income seniors may be eligible for a partial exemption in their taxes. To see if you qualify, please contact the Assessor's office.
- The County Budget Director provided an overview of the 2 year budget that was approved, totaling \$11 billion dollars. There were no serious cuts in this budget. The Sheriff's Office and Roads Department were provided with minimal additions, but no significant reductions in services.
- Sheriff Urquhart applauded Deputy Sam Shirley who patrols the Fairwood area and also introduced Greg Thomas, the new mayor in Maple Valley. Sheriff Urquhart spoke about the immigration issue, including Sanctuary Cities, Presidential directives, and what the Sheriff's office can/cannot

legally enforce. He reported that shootings are up throughout King County and his office is creating additional task forces focused on curbing illegal guns. Overall, burglaries and car thefts are down, but car prowls are up slightly. Be diligent by locking your vehicles that are parked outside and removing any valuables.

- The Department of Transportation touched on issues including increased Metro routes, Roads Maintenance, and a new Roads Helpline Card for residents. This card provides direct phone numbers to report roads issues. Those numbers are 206-477-8100 or 1-800-527-6237. The Roads Department noted that there will be significant repaving projects going on throughout the county over the next year.
- Permitting & Environmental Review discussed building permits, general land use and a request to rezone an R-6 area to R-18. This request is from a large contractor hoping to build an 80-unit apartment complex in the Molasses Creek area.
- New to the Open House this year was the Law Enforcement Oversight Department, which provides civilian oversight & transparency. They participate in internal investigation oversight, use of force oversight, outreach, and individual investigations.
- Of significant discussion and concern was the Board of Public Health's proposed Heroin Injection Site in King County (no exact location has been proposed yet). Both Sheriff Urquhart and Councilman Dunn reassured residents that this site will not be placed in Fairwood. Public Health will take names and information from residents interested in this and keep them informed.
- A representative from Sound Transit provided details on the recent ST-3 proposal. The Sound Ford property down by Grady Way is being purchased and will become a Sound Transit Park & Ride site. The ST-3 proposal, which was voted on by King County voters, unfortunately provides very little as far as services for the Renton/Newcastle/Fairwood area. There is currently no representation from these areas on the Sound Transit Board.
- During the public comment period, discussions included the 2012 Youth Center which has been delayed for over 3 years, Urban Growth areas, Sales Tax & Property Taxes, Immigrant holds, legal services for undocumented immigrants, Rapid Transit & the Community Connections pilot program, and the re-zoning proposal to upgrade density near Molasses Creek.
