The KCSO's dedicated/contracted Fairwood patrols are intended to provide high visibility as well as traffic rules enforcement. In November these patrols resulted in the following stats:

- 3 Parking Issue Enforcements
- 3 NOI's (tickets) issued for moving violations
- 64 Initiated Citizen Contacts
 - 6 Other activities including patrol assists and one driver apprehension following a fleeing vehicle with the driver running away.

Three patrols were nighttime patrols (after 10:00 p.m.). The monthly Securitas report showed a slight uptick in noise complaints and abandoned vehicles. The hourly rates for Deputy Patrols will increase in 2019.
