- **08:45 AM – 09:00 AM | Departure & Logistics**

Departure: Complimentary minibus departs from the University of Cyprus, Kallipoleos Campus.

Larnaca Guests: Travel directly to Choirokoitia in private cars to meet the group.

- **09:45 AM – 10:45 AM | Ancient History at Choirokoitia**

Exploration: Visit to the UNESCO World Heritage Site (Neolithic settlement).

Car Switch: Larnaca guests leave private cars at Choirokoitia and join the group on the minibus.

- **11:45 AM – 01:00 PM | Scenic Drive to the Valleys**

Arakapas Village: Visit to the 15th-century Church of Panayia Imatiki, famous for its unique wooden roof and frescoes.

- **01:00 PM – 02:30 PM | Lunch at Kalamaras Restaurant**

Traditional Meze or Cypriot Food: A traditional gastronomic experience in Arakapas village.

- **02:30 PM – 04:30 PM | The Heritage Trail: From Bridges to Lace**

Akapnou: Photo stop at the medieval Venetian stone bridge.

Vavla Village: A scenic drive through this protected heritage village, known for its white stone architecture and tranquil atmosphere.

Agios Minas Monastery: Visit to the 15th-century convent.

Important Practical Notes for Day 2
