

## Rights Policy

People with a disability have rights and dignity, these should be respected all the time.



People with a disability have a right to access services free from abuse, neglect, exploitation and/ or discrimination.



Our staff are trained in identifying risks to help keep you safe. Your safety is important to us.



Our participants are treated equal to all other people in society and have a right to access full participation.

This means:

- You can make decisions about your life
- Decide, what services that you want to participate in
- You can access support to help you make these choices and decisions (eg. Interpreter, translator, advocacy)



We work with you, your family, carers, support workers, advocates in helping you achieve your goals.

We work with parents when they are the legal guardian to help them make decisions that are in the best interests of their children.



We keep your personal information private and confidential. We only provide information to the people you give us written permission to, or if we are required by Law to provide this information (eg. To FACS or the Police)
