Our Proud History

In 1965, the *STL Special Needs Boy Scout Troop* 724 was established for boys with special needs in the St. Louis region.

in 1999, a new tradition was introduced to the troop-presenting the colors-which provided the boys with a way to demonstrate respect for America's veterans, past and present, while building pride in themselves.

In 2010, the troop began wearing red berets and started the annual *Flags for Heroes*-which retires American flags and flags of our military. In 7 years, over 20,000 flags were ceremonially retired from service and a total of 35,000 American flags were purchased to display on the grave sites of fallen heroes at *Jefferson Barracks National Cemetery* each Veteran's Day.

In 2020, the troop name was changed to the *STL Special Needs Color Guard* and continued retiring of flags, laying flags on veterans graves, and presenting the colors at dedication and public ceremonies.

And in 2022, the *STL Special Needs Color Guard* became a 501 (c)(3), nonprofit organization to continue our growth and expansion plans from individual, business and corporate donations-Like You!
