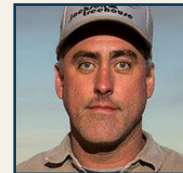
The arts help us connect to our inner selves and understand the world around us. Which is why PFAC remains dedicated to continuing to offer programming and inventing new ways of connecting our community.

“ART HELPS STUDENTS DEVELOP CREATIVITY, WHICH IS THE ENGINE FOR ENTREPRENEURS”

Thank you for the opportunity to say a few words about the Pinedale Fine Arts Council (PFAC). In my role as a legislator, I was assigned to the Education Committee, and it became very apparent that local districts, especially small districts, are challenged when providing art opportunities to their students. Art helps students develop creativity, which is the engine for entrepreneurs, and it helps hold students in school.

PFAC has stepped into that void through the years in Sublette County, and has brought in talented artists from a broad range of genres. These artists come into the schools, and provide invaluable instruction. They also give students a firsthand glimpse of real working artists, which is rarity in these small Wyoming communities.

PFAC also brings these same artists to the public, by providing

evening events. They also help fund a summer concert in the park series, which is well attended, and this is provided free to the public. PFAC is an outstanding organization, which provides art opportunities to Sublette County, opportunities that would not be seen otherwise.

Albert Sommers has lived in Sublette County all of his life. His grandparents were early homesteaders in the Green River Valley. Sommers graduated with honors from the University of Wyoming.

SCHOOL RESIDENCIES

The Arts in Education programming PFAC provides includes school performances and classroom lectures that last anywhere from a single day to a full week. Of our programs in the schools 95% are directly requested by the teachers to fulfill a curriculum or state standard that would be hard to reach in another way.

We reach every student K – 12 including special needs students.

PFAC gives every student in Sublette County at least 2 exposures to the arts per year – with at least one being a hands-on experience.

SCHOOL RESIDENCIES: S.T.E.A.M

One of PFAC's best received school programs "Eurekus" - STEAM learning. Based out of Denver, two instructors come to Pinedale Middle School, Pinedale High School and Big Piney Middle School for week-long workshops .

STEAM is a nation-wide initiative to incorporate Arts into the Science, Technology, Engineering and Math curriculum.

Getting hands-on with science, technology, engineering, art, and math inspires students to:

1. See themselves as makers and creators
2. Develop critical thinking and problem-solving skills
3. Gain the confidence to experiment, tinker, and try
4. Approach learning with creativity and curiosity



SUMMER ARTS CAMPS

Launched in 2015, PFAC now offers two Summer Art Camps (STEAM and Dance Camps) that serve between 40-50 students each summer. Campers participate in a week full of engaging, hand-on arts workshops focusing on visual arts, dance and STEAM learning. At the end of the summer campers in the visual/dance camp perform for the community at one of our Soundcheck events in American Legion Park (pictured).

Summer Camp spots fill up quick so be sure to check our website in early Spring for registration info.

Since 2007 PFAC has served as an umbrella organization for the Pinedale Community Theatre (PTC). All PTC performances utilize local residents to perform and mount the shows. It's a rare artistic opportunity for the residents of Sublette County. This year's performance of "Beauty and the Beast" involved over 85 community members singing, dancing, playing in the orchestra, painting the sets, sewing costumes, and doing marketing. This production was widely considered the best one to date – with a record 4 sold out performances.



PINEDALE PUBLIC ART

Pinedale Public Art (PPA) is a comprehensive public arts program placing temporary and permanent works of art throughout the Pinedale community. The program aims to enhance our community through dialog, education and visibility of contemporary visual arts as it applies to our west central Wyoming community.

PPA is a self-contained program of PFAC that fundraises all of its own money to fund public art in Pinedale. To date they have installed pieces by 19 artists – 17 of which are local. Pictured left is the latest PPA project: American Legion Park powerbox art by Mae Orm.

KENTUCKY DERBY FUNDRAISER



Pinedale Fine Arts holds an annual Kentucky Derby fundraiser every year to support the student arts programs. Held at the Sublette County Fairgrounds, aka the Ice Box Downs, it features live music, catered dinner, calcutta and a stick horse obstacle course race. The horse teams are sponsored by local businesses and consist of three people dressed in costume riding a decorated broom. It's laugh out loud entertaining and so much fun!

PFAC ELDER CARE PROGRAMS



PFAC launched its Elder Care Programs in 2018 with two new monthly art classes catered to seniors and their caregivers.

The first is "Here and Now – A Dementia Focused Art Class." This includes persons living with Dementia and their caregivers. Creating art gives elders a sense of mastering, the ability to make something admired by others, a distraction from aches and pains, and a social opportunity to engage with others.

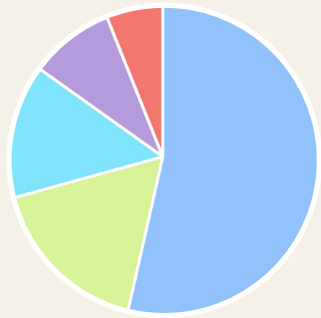
The second program is called "TimeSlips"

which is creative storytelling for people with dementia. The program involves a storyteller who presents a classic painting and leads participants through different exercises creating stories about the painting. TimeSlips is designed to be life affirming, inspiring and grounding. It opens storytelling to everyone by replacing the pressure to remember with the freedom to imagine.

With these programs we hope to improve well-being through creativity and connection.

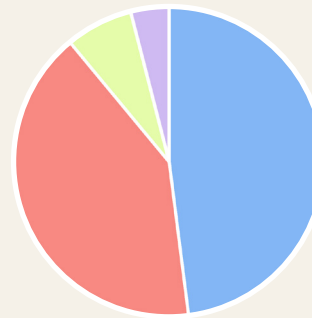
