Circa 1877 - 1901	Lafayette, Indiana	<ul style="list-style-type: none">● She grew up in Lafayette.● She worked for the Wabash Railroad around 1898 to 1901.
1901 - 1903	Detroit, Michigan	She works as the Extension Secretary for the Y.W.C.A. in Detroit
1903	Lafayette, Indiana	<ul style="list-style-type: none">● Returns to Lafayette and returns to work for the Wabash Railroad● Marries Carlos in 1903
Circa 1903 - 1904	Ocoya, Illinois	<ul style="list-style-type: none">● After marriage, she moved in with Carlos in Ocoya● Ocoya was a very small town, approximately 100 miles southwest of Chicago on Route 66, now on Interstate 55.● According to Wikipedia, the Baptist church there was built in 1871 but does not appear on a current map.● Their first child, Dorothy Irwin Dinsmore, was born in Chenoa, Illinois, about 5 miles from Ocoya.
Circa 1904 – 1907	Harvey, Illinois (Chicago area)	<ul style="list-style-type: none">● She accompanies Carlos as he changed churches in 1904 and while he received a bachelor’s degree at University of Chicago in 1907● There are currently three Baptist church buildings in Harvey, two of which are boarded up. Abundance Baptist Church (corner of E. 154th Street & Lexington, New Bethel Missionary Baptist Church (corner of E. 154th Street and Broadway) and South Suburban Missionary Baptist Church (corner of E. 152nd Street and Lexington)● 1907 - Margaret Millson Dinsmore was born.
1907-1914	Anderson, Indiana	<ul style="list-style-type: none">● Carlos becomes lead pastor for Anderson Baptist Church, an hour northeast of Indianapolis● 1911 - Their 3rd child, William James “Jim” Dinsmore was born there
1914 - 1915	Evansville, Indiana	<ul style="list-style-type: none">● Carlos was lead pastor for Baptist church in Evansville, Indiana● Daughter Dorothy contracts and recovers from typhoid fever
1915 – 1931	Indianapolis, Indiana	<ul style="list-style-type: none">● Their 4th child, Bertha Elizabeth was born there● Washington Avenue residence● WWI occurs
Circa 1931 – 1937	East Orange, New Jersey	<ul style="list-style-type: none">● Their inferred residence in 1935 is East Orange, Essex, New Jersey.● Her mother Emeline Irwin Buschman died in 1935
Circa 1937 – 1941	Teaneck, New Jersey	<ul style="list-style-type: none">● The 1940 Census shows Carlos and Bertha’s home at that time to be Teaneck, Bergen, New Jersey, and his occupation is Minister, and he owns their house, and that its value is \$8,500.● When son, Jim, and daughter-in-law, Bonnie Maude, were visiting them there, there are pictures of Bonnie Elizabeth Dinsmore Riordan with them in Teaneck when she was 7 months old. So, it had to be in 1937.● Her father, August Buschman died in 1938.
1941 – 1948	South Haven, Michigan	<ul style="list-style-type: none">● Pastor First Baptist Church South Haven Michigan beginning in October of 1941 until he retired● World War II occurs● 1948: Carlos dies
1948 - 1962	South Haven, Michigan and Children’s Locations	<ul style="list-style-type: none">● She stayed in Michigan. BEDR recalls continuing to visit her there.● She spent the winter months with her kids on rotation● Her sister, Grace, died in 1963.
1962 - 1966	Maywood, Illinois	<ul style="list-style-type: none">● Moved to Maywood, Illinois into the Baptist Retirement Home at 316 Randolph Street● Selected Maywood likely to be near her daughter, Margaret
