<u>Recipe Share</u>

Emma's rhubarb dessert

(submitted by Eileen Killpack)

4 c. diced rhubarb

1 c. sugar

1 pkg. red jello mix these three ingredients and put in 9x13 pan

Sprinkle 1 pkg. dry yellow or white cake mix over it

Melt 1/3 c. butter in 1 c. water and pour over. Bake for 1 hour at 350.

PINEAPPLE TORTE-GEORGIA BRACKER
1# vanilla wafers
2 C pwd sugar
1/2 C butter
3 eggs (beaten)
1 C crushed pineapple (drained)
1 C whipped cream
1/2 C nuts

Crush wafers. Use half on bottom, rest on top. Blend pwd. sugar and butter. Add eggs and fold in rest of ingredients.

DATE PUDDING-MRS RICHARD FOX
1 C white sugar
1/2 C milk 2 t B.P.
1 C dates 1 t vanilla
1/2 C nuts

Mix in order given, mix well and put into greased (layer cake) pan. Then pour over it 2 T butter 2 C boiling water, pinch salt, and 1 C brown sugar boiled together. Bake at 350° about 40 min. Serve with whipped cream. The pudding is done when the syrup is all baked in, but do not overbake.

You can use raisins, prunes or apples in place of the dates.
